The farm housing program authorized by recent act of congress, is now underway in Malheur county. Applications for loans to build or repair farm houses and other farm buildings are being received at the farmers home administration office.

The housing act is authorized for a four-year period of loan making. The appropriation for the current year is \$27,000,000 for the entire nation's loans.

Loans may run for a maximum of 33 years at 4 percent interest and be made to farm owners who cannot obtain housing loans from their banks or other sources. They will go to farmers with farm earnings and other income enough to repay the loan plus interest without further help from the government.

Loans will be made for repairs and remodeling as well as for new structures. Applicants may apply at the FHA office in the basement of the Moore bus depot on Tuesdays.

First National Loans Increase

In answer to the April 24 call of the comptroller of the currency, the Nyssa branch of the First National Bank of Portland reports deposits of \$3,338,860; and loans of \$1,922,390. In charge of the local banking office is G. J. Mitchell, manager.

On April 11, 1949, the figures were as follows: Deposits \$3,503,933; loans, \$1,735,367.

The First National Bank of Portland, with 45 branches, reports deposits of \$462,118,955; and loans of \$157,577,631. Against this loan figure, there has been set up out of earnings from January 1, 1949 to April 24, 1950, a reserve for possible loan losses in the amount of \$743,733. This reserve is to apply against any loan losses that may develop in the future. It has not been allocated to any particular loans or type of

loans. Total resources are \$504,645,-

\$307, according to F. N. Belgrano, Jr., president.
