Mrs. Lola Stenger of Seattle is visiting her sister, Mrs. J. M. Lowe.

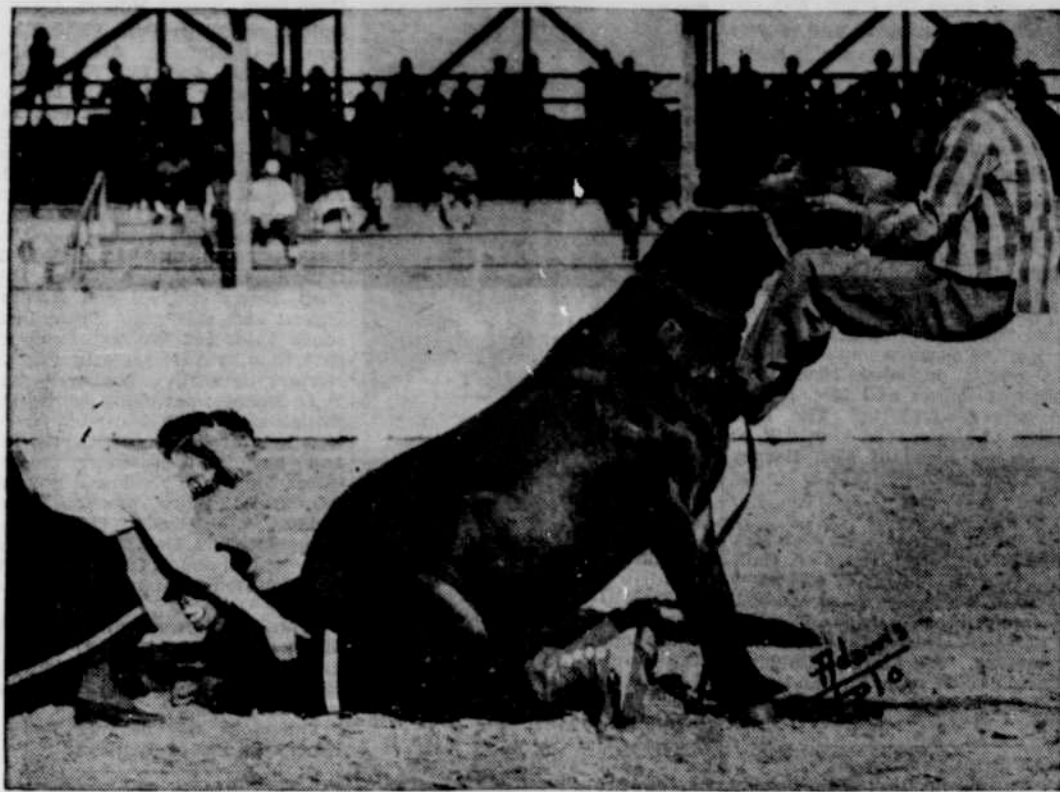
