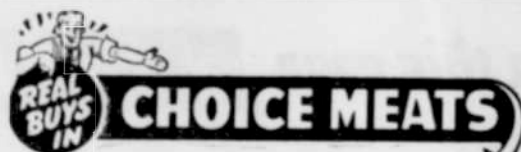

Gordon's Drive In RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Fruit Upside Down Cake

1/4 cup butter or margarine

1/2 cup brown sugar

No. 21/2 can fruit cocktail, well drained

1 package white cake mix

1/2 cup Sego Milk

1/2 cup water

Melt butter over very low heat in 9-in. skillet or deep cake pan holding 9 cups. Remove from heat. Sprinkle sugar over melted butter. Sprinkle fruit over sugar. Let stand. Put cake mix into bowl. Mix milk with water, then stir half of it into cake mix. Beat vigorously 1 min. Stir in rest of milk mixture; beat vigorously 2 min. Pour batter over fruit. Bake in moderate oven (375°) about 35 min., or until cake pulls from sides of pan. Let cake stand in pan 5 min. before turning out. Serve warm or cold.

*Use any of the well-known brands calling for milk on the package.
