Undergoes Surgery—Mrs. Wilbur Holcomb is recuperating at her home following surgery performed Monday at the Holy Rosary hospital.

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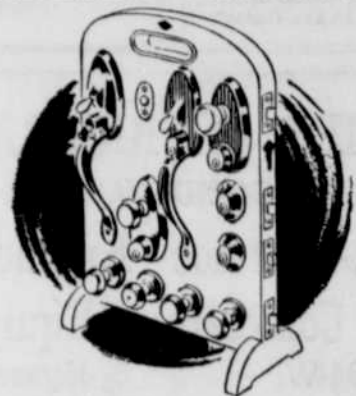
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
