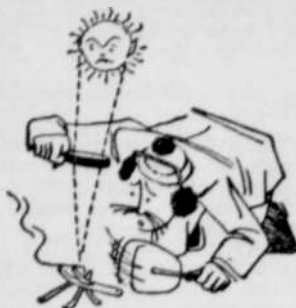


Elderly Couple Honored at Party

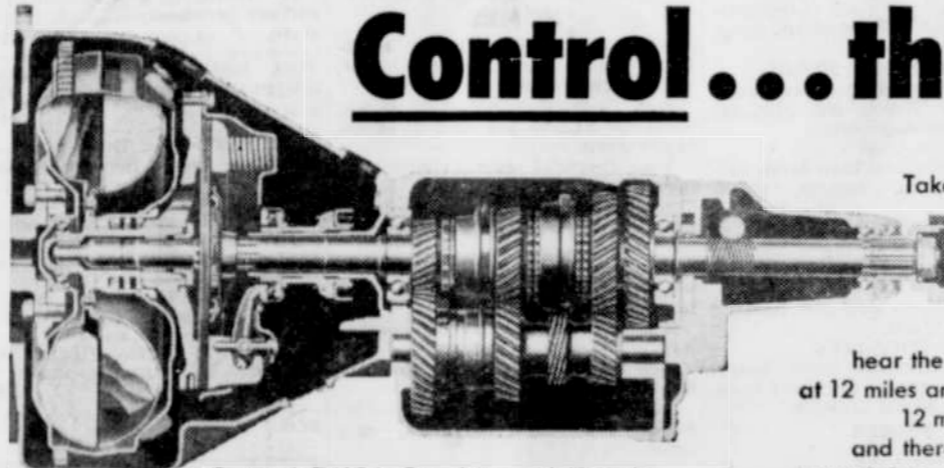

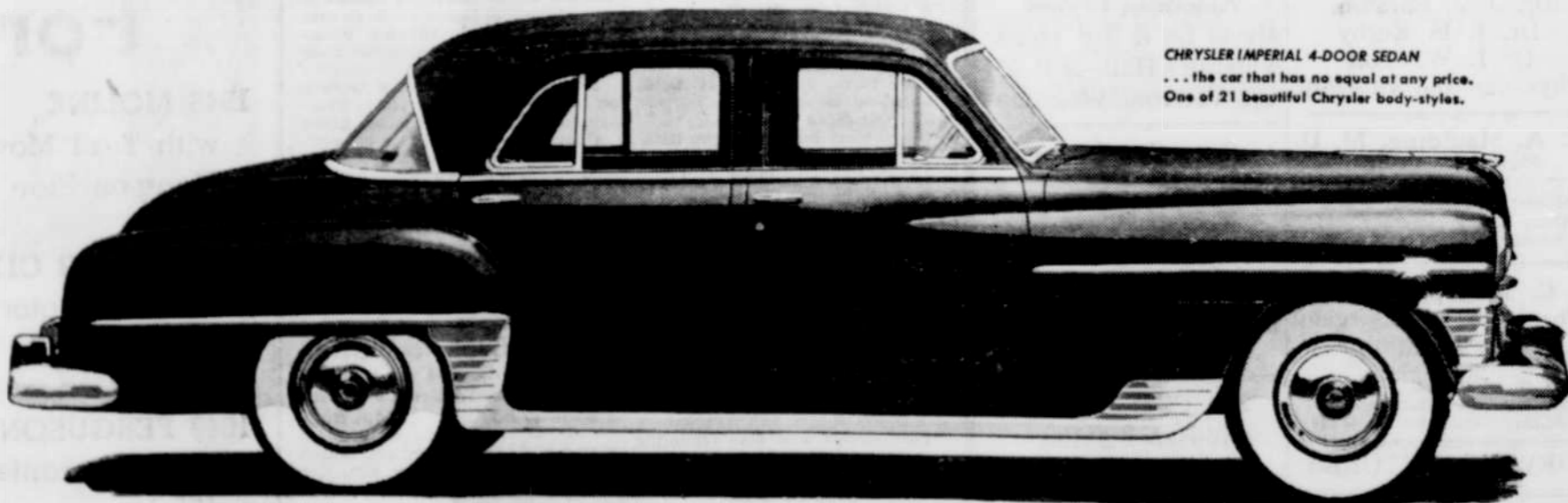
