Mrs. Ralph Baxter and Denny Heap attended a birthday party

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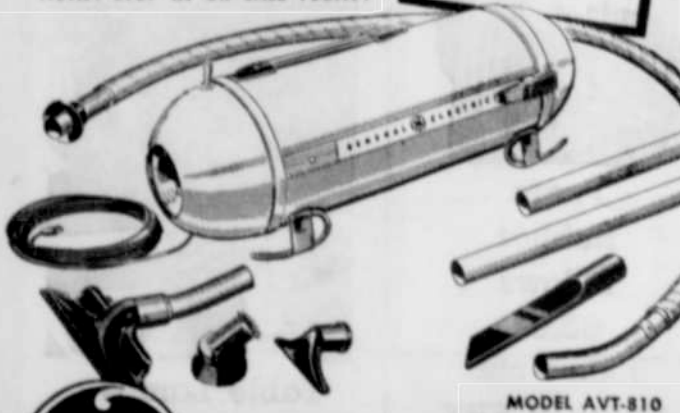


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honoring Denny's brother, Gary, in Caldwell Saturday afternoon.

New Tuberculosis Cases Reported

Since Mrs. Edna Farris returned to work as county health nurse, four new cases of tuberculosis have been reported to the health office. One has been hospitalized, two are convalescing at home and one's application to the Eastern Oregon State Tuberculosis hospital is pending.

The follow-up on these four cases means re-x-rays for the patients themselves and the first x-rays for members of their families, which includes, as far as we have investigated 17 x-ray films", Mrs. Farris said. "The greater part of these x-rays are paid for through money derived from the sale of Christmas seals, which are now being sold through the Malheur County Tuberculosis and Health association. Up to November 1, 1950 the Malheur County Tuberculosis and Health association had paid for 44 follow-up

x-rays of contacts of active tuberculosis cases.

"Our actual tuberculosis case load as of today is 70 patients. These are active tuberculosis contacts or suspected cases. All are being x-rayed as their physician recommends, some every year, some every six months, some every three months and a few each month.

"In fact, our health department records show that the Malheur County Tuberculosis and Health association has cooperated with the Malheur county public health department in an effort to control tuberculosis in the county to the extent of paying for 512 x-rays since January 1, 1945—exclusive of mass x-ray surveys. The 512 x-rays include the 44 x-rays that have been taken up to November 1, 1950.

"The money derived through the sale of Christmas seals is the sole support of all activities of the Malheur County Tuberculosis and Health association. It seems to me Malheur county owes the county tuberculosis and health association sincere thanks since in numerous cases these x-rays could not have been taken. It is the difference between a controlled tuberculosis program and an uncontrolled one."

Tune-up In Health Series Broadcast

KSRV, along with many other local stations throughout Oregon, is cooperating with the schools of Oregon in broadcasting the "Oregon School of the Air" (Tune-Up in Health) series every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 3 p. m. to 3:15 p. m. 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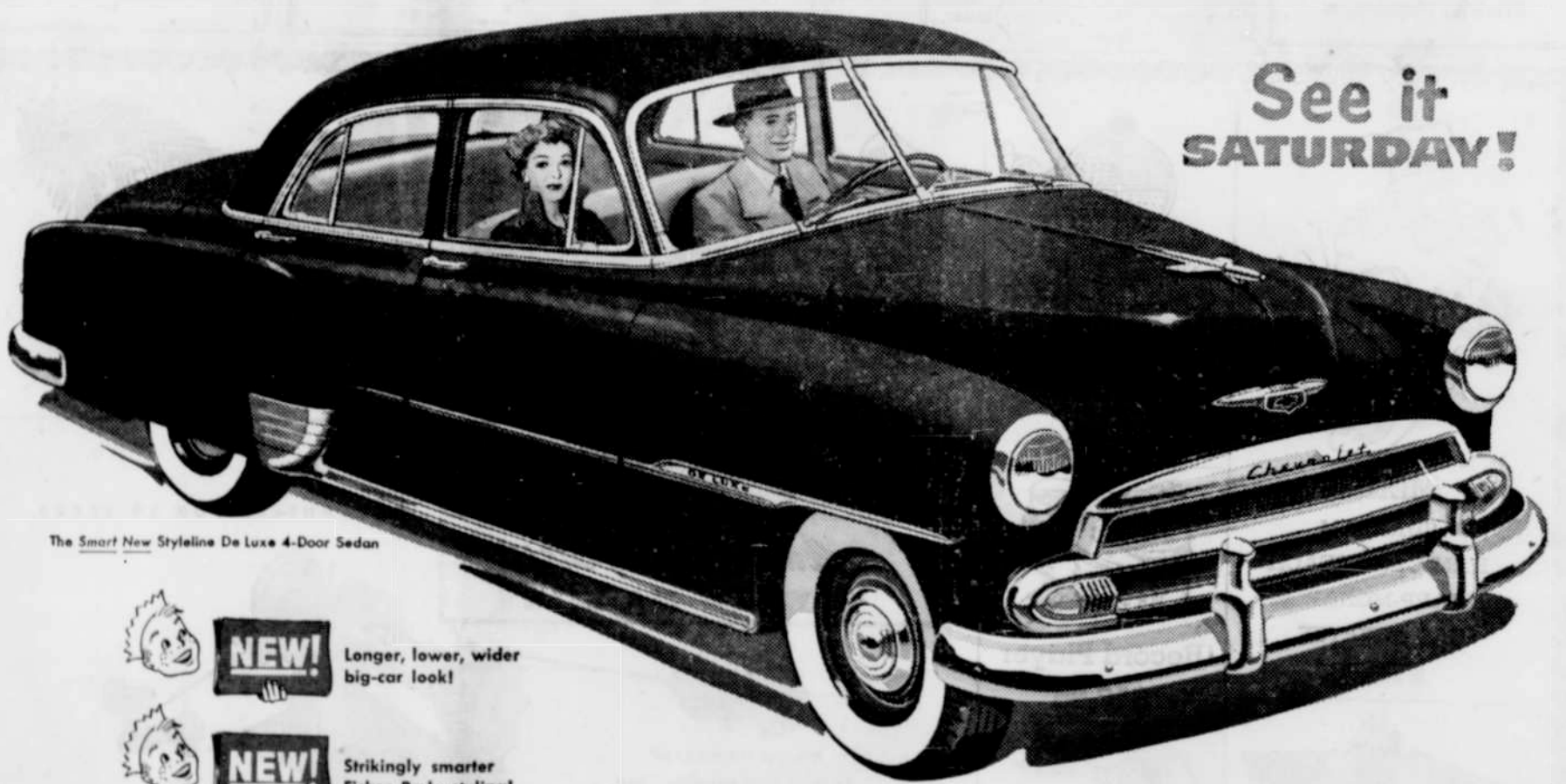
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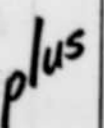
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
