time four inches of rain fell in five minutes. Coming through Wyoming they saw six inches of snow on the ground.

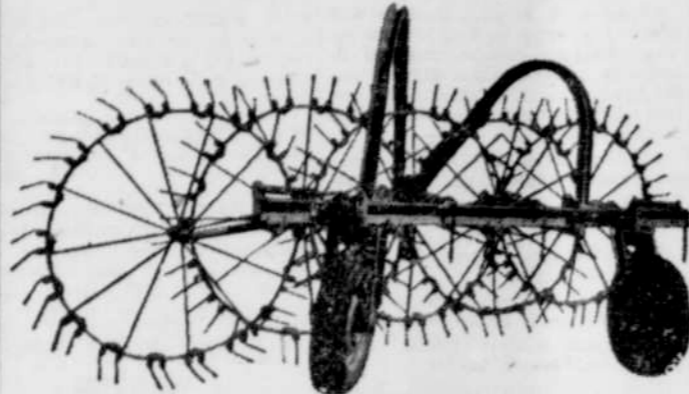
On Business In Utah—Mr. and Mrs. Luther Fife and two daughters, spent part of last week in Utah on business.

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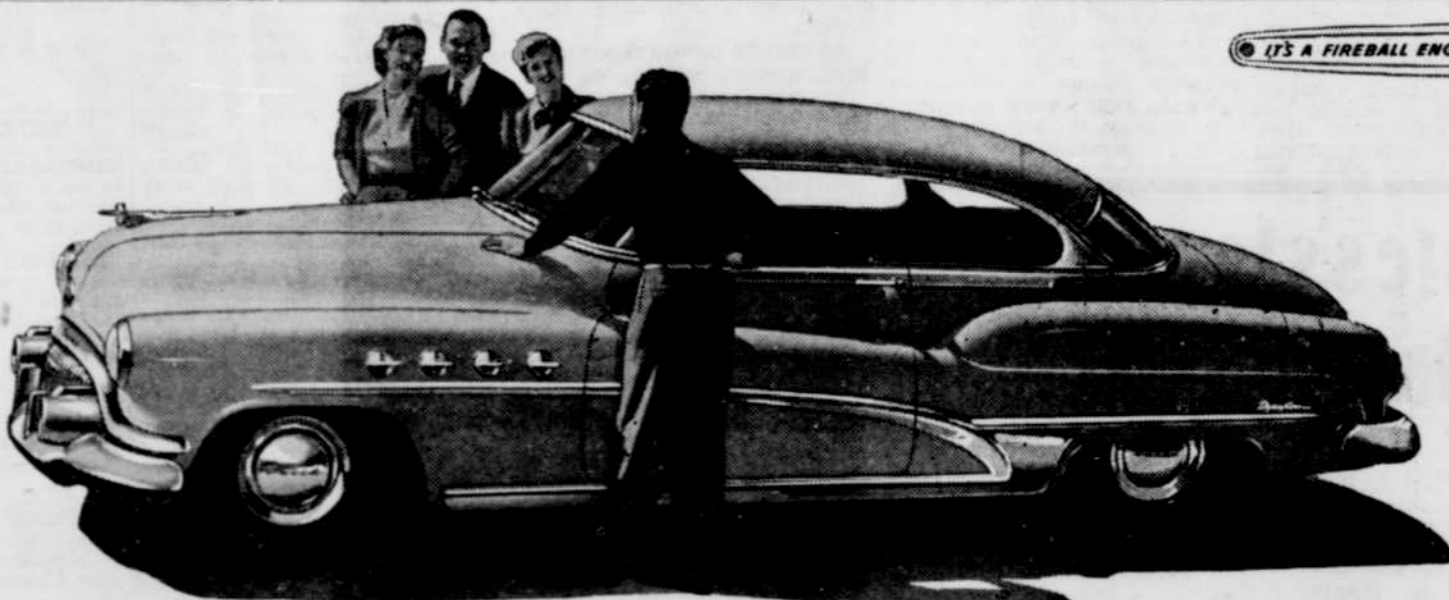
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
