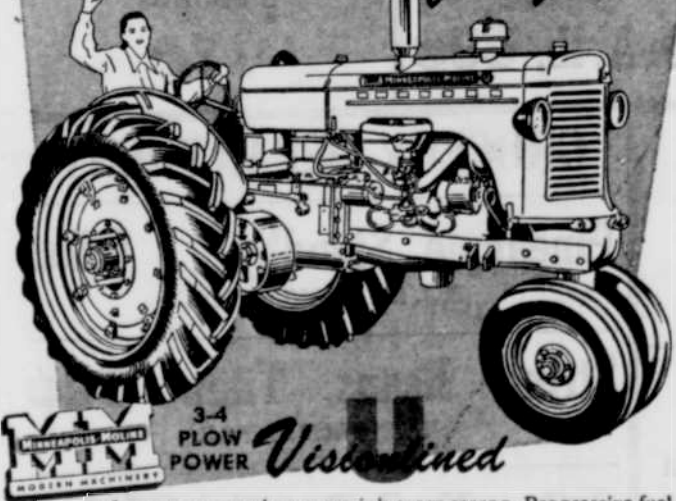

The Freedom bell, which 200,000 Oregonians helped make possible by their contributions to the Crusade for Freedom last year, has, since
