Dale W. Medearis to Work In Church

Dale W. Medearis, national director of town and country church work among Christian churches, will lead a "church life revival" at the Church of Christ a. Fifth and Ennis in Nyssa, beginning Sunday, February 3. Mr. Medearis, according to Rev. Austin J. Hollingsworth, local pastor, is a graduate of Texas Christian university of Forth Worth, Texas. He has held pastorates in Texas and Georgia. The particular responsibility of Mr. Medearis is in developing a program of work in churches in small towns and open country where 70 per cent of the congregations of the Christian church brotherhood are located.

Mr. Medearis, according to the local pastor, will speak at the 11 a. m. and 8 p. m. services next Sunday. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday he will hold at a stated period each day a training conference for rural pastors and at night he will meet with different departments of the local church. On the remaining week nights, with the exception of Saturday, until February 15, he will lead a series of evangelistic services. The public is invited to attend.
