In accordance with the provisions of the "Local Budget Law" (Sections 110-1215, O.C.L.A., as amended), notice is hereby given that the budget committee of Malheur County, Oregon, in compliance with the laws, prepared and adopted May 22, 1952 the budget estimates for Malheur County, Oregon for the ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1952 to June 30, 1953. All persons are hereby notified that on June 30, 1952 in Vale, Oregon, said budget estimates may be discussed with the County Court, the levying board for Malheur County, Oregon, and any person subject to the proposed tax levy or tax levies will be heard in favor of or against said proposed tax levies or any part thereof.
