Emergency Ban On Hog Imports By Ag. Dept.

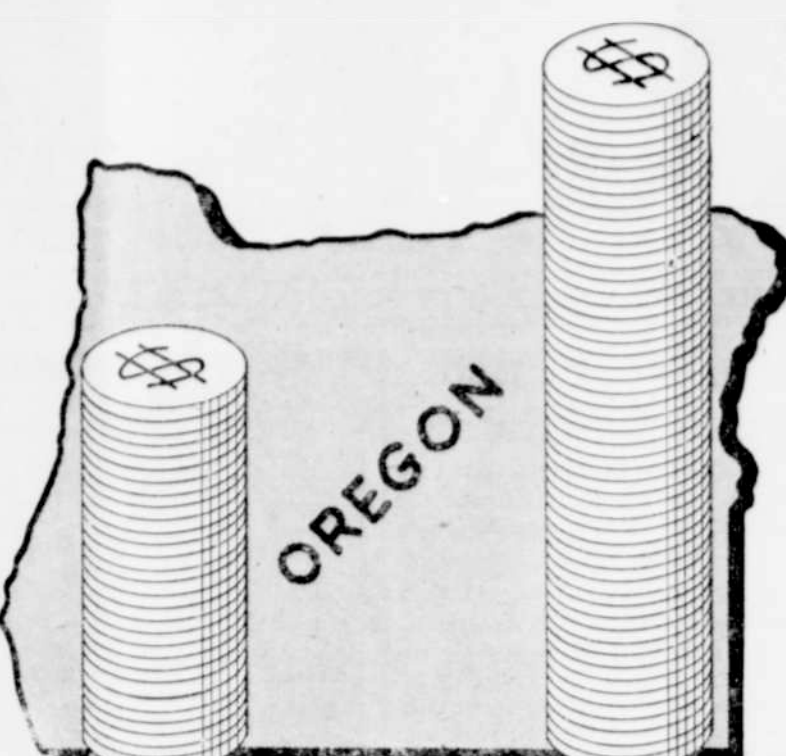
