OSC Names Iowa Man to Head Work
The responsibility for the future development of a sound soil and water use program for Oregon passed to an Iowa State college expert on soils and crops recently with the appointment of Dr. Rorace B. Cheney as new head of the soils department at Oregon State college.

Another major appointment was that of Wilbur T. Cooney, associate professor of poultry husbandry at OSC, as assistant dean of agriculture.

The new head of the soils department has worked on soils research and served as chairman of the soils and crops extension group at Iowa State since 1942. In his work, Dr. Cheney has helped to direct and develop an Iowa soils testing program similar to the one being established for Oregon at the present time by OSC. He succeeds Dr. W. L. Powers, who retired this summer after 43 years service.

As assistant dean, Cooney will direct all resident teaching in the school of agriculture. A product of the Roseburg schools and OSC, he has been on the college staff since 1937. His appointment fills the vacancy created in 1950 when F. E. Price was raised from that position to dean and director.

Four Farm Youths Fair Appearance
Visitors at the state fair in Salem this year will have a chance to meet four International Farm Youth Exchange delegates now visiting Oregon, and talk with them about their homelands and the IFYE program, announces Mrs. Winnifred Gillen, state 4-H agent at Oregon State college.

They are Valerie Nicholson, 21, Lancaster, England; Lore Gortter, 24, Baden, Germany; Pentti Antila, 26, Lavia, Finland; and Russell Stalker, 21, Rangiora, New Zealand.

The young people will be located at an "International Booth" in the fair Aug. 30 to Sept. 6, with the exception of Miss Nicholson, who will be there only until Sept. 2.

Under the IFYE program, selected young people spend up to four months in a foreign country, living and working with farm families to promote mutual understanding. Twenty-eight nations are participating.

This summer, two OSC students are delegates abroad. They are Patricia Horning, 21, Sherwood, now in the Netherlands, and David Patterson, 21, Mulino, who is in Finland.

The IFYE group who will attend the fair have already been "working guests" of several Oregon families. Miss Nicholson spent two weeks on the Joe Rogers dairy farm, Independence, and her next stop will be the Otto Lucht farm, Mollala. Miss Gortter is now with the J. L. Herold family, Creswell, after attending the Lane county 4-H camp.

Antila spent several weeks on the Dan Warnock ranch at Baker, is now on the Archie Riekkola seed farm, Astoria, and will also spend some time on the P. A. Wells farm, Independence. Stalker visited the John Jacob Astor Experiment Station at Astoria, is now on the C. R. Clymptner ranch near Canyonville, and is scheduled to visit the Rudy Bernet dairy farm, Scappoose.

Ontario Charged with Pollution of Streams
Riddance of the waters of Oregon of raw sewage pollution moved a step nearer with the citation of Ontario to appear before the Oregon State Sanitary Authority in Portland, on Oct. 17, to answer for violating the state law.

Two other cities, Gresham and Enterprise, are cited to appear at the same time.

Nyssa and Vale were among 10 Oregon cities that have already appeared before the state body, which has delivered its ultimatum to conform to the state sanitation laws by certain dates.

The authority declares it is determined to clean up Oregon streams in the near future.
