conference standing.—Miss Ellen Judd, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Maurice Judd, was elected vice president of Pinney Hall, C. of I.

10 Years Ago Oct. 29, 1942

Rationing of coffee will be started in Nyssa and other sections of the nation November 28 at the rate of one pound for each person over 15 years old every five weeks.—The spreading of oil on the runways at Ontario Municipal Airport actually started Wednesday.—Gerald Greer, Jim Fagan, Virgil Jordan and Duane Weeks will enter the Marines Nov. 1.—The school board voted to re-open the high school Nov. 2 regardless of the labor situation. Schools have been closed since Oct. 6, except for a return to school one day.—Mrs. C. C. Wyckoff received word that her son, Dwight has enlisted in the Navy.—Mrs. George Sallee and Tommy left for Kansas City, Mo. for a visit.

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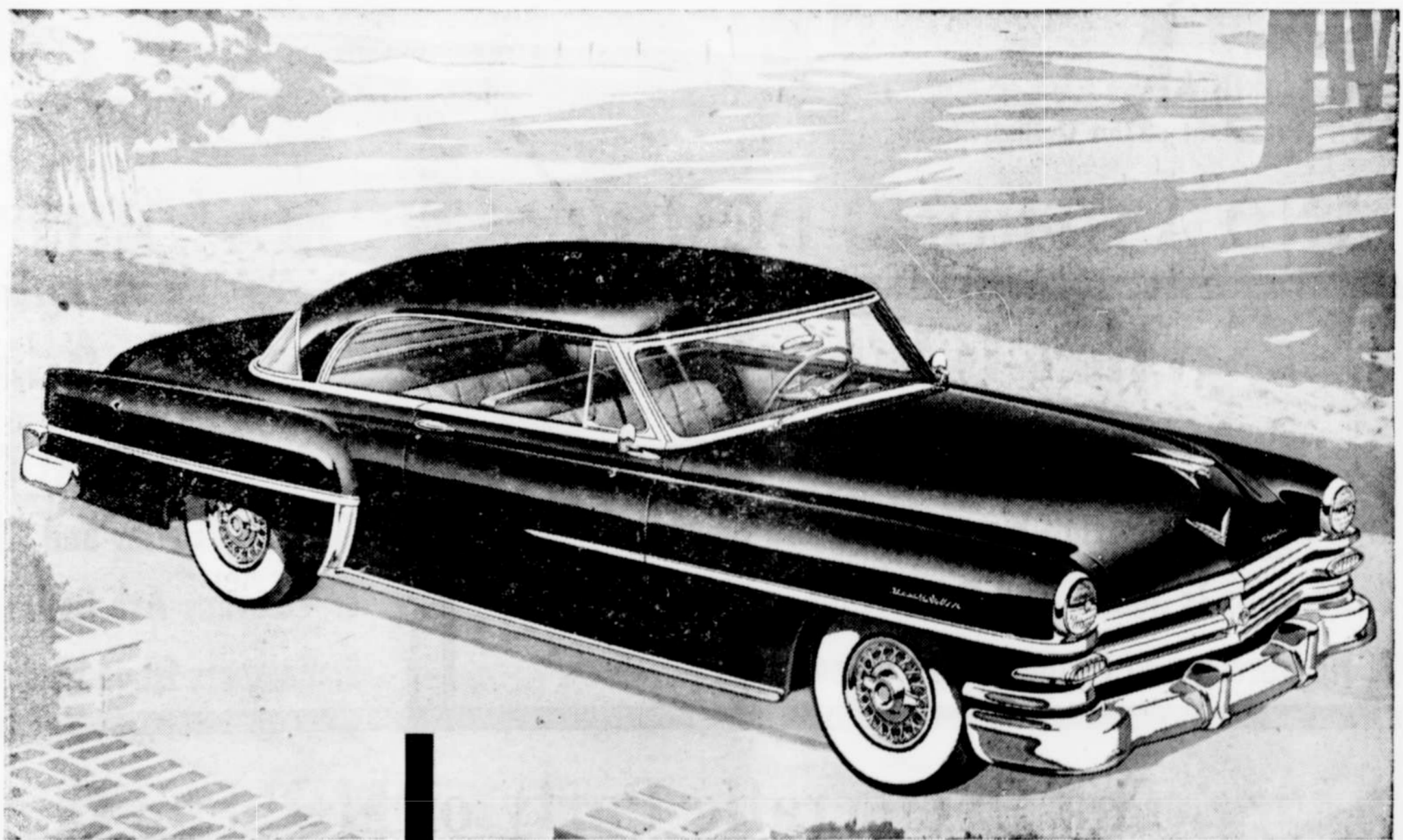
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
