Travel Featured In New Books At County Library

The Malheur County Library in Ontario offers another attractive group of new books to be seen this week at the circulation desk and to go into circulation Saturday, Dec. 13.

The traveler of either the armchair or the itching-feet variety will thoroughly enjoy "Scandinavia," one of the "World in Color" series, which describes the countries of Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Finland, and Iceland.

The U. S. tourist will enjoy the background information in the book edited by Roderick Peattie called "The Black Hills," a collection of essays about people like Wild Bill Hickok and Calamity Jane and about events like the discovery of the Homestake Mine.

Prospective travelers of future ages will want to learn of the efforts that have been made to escape this planet and explore others by reading Wiley Ley's "Rockets, Missiles, and Space Travel."

"Handicraft Hobbies for Profit" by Robert Scharff deals with wood-working, plastics, metalwork, ceramics, and leathercraft, besides offering a chapter on "The Business Side of a Craft" and lists of sources of supply and sales outlets.

"Hollywood, U. S. A. from Script to Screen" by Alice Field tells what goes into the making of a motion

picture. A new western by Clay Fisher about a wagon train on the Santa Fe Trail is called "Santa Fe Passage."

Zoe Schiller writes a novel "A Candle for a Star" in which Duncan MacGregor, pioneer settler of the Northwest, builds a theater and opens it with a pageant depicting scenes such as he himself had once lived through in the early days of the Northwest.

Mary O'Hara now turns to a new locale for her latest novel, "The Son of Adam Wyngate." Bartholomew Wyngate, popular minister of Brooklyn Heights in the early 1900's, is torn by misgiving when his brother, Ramsay, former fiancé of his wife, returns from abroad.

Emily Hahn writes "a glandular history of civilization" which she calls "Love Conquers Nothing." This is a collection of essays about sentimental love affairs involving such personalities as Helen of Troy, Cleopatra, Henry VIII, and Lady Hamilton. The book's thesis is that it is ambition, not love which has influenced the course of history.

at the Wilson home. Mrs. Swigart and Mrs. Wilson were business visitors in Boise Monday.

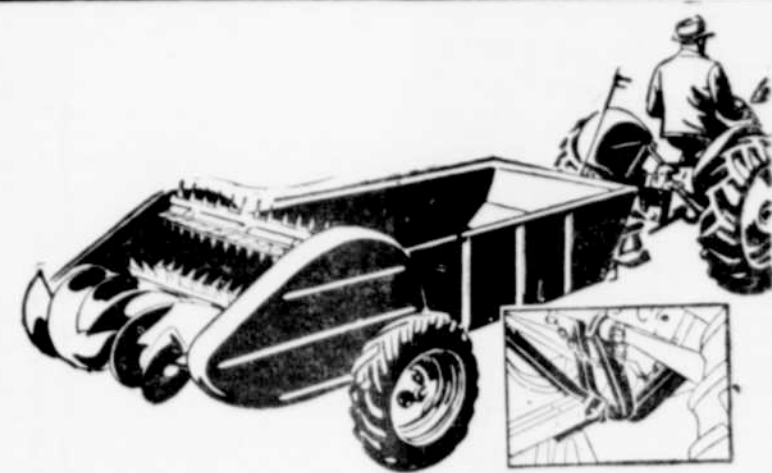
