Building Permits Total \$110,677 Here During 1952

Building permits for construction of buildings totaling \$110,677 were issued during 1952, according to records on file with Mrs. Hilda Tensen, Nyssa city clerk.

Five business buildings accounted for the largest share of construction and the largest of these was the J. C. Watson Produce Co., which built a new \$25,000 packing house last summer. Second largest construction job was the Malheur Home Telephone Co.'s \$21,000 structures to house the new dial telephone system for the Nyssa area.

During the year building permits were issued for only three new houses, totaling \$27,000. Alterations on existing dwellings came to a total of \$7,000 for 12 different repair or enlargement jobs. There were six garages, totaling \$4,900, built during the year.

Four different owners or tenants of business buildings saw fit to remodel or make alterations on existing business buildings for a total amount of \$11,277.
