#### Missionary Will Speak Monday

The Rev. Gerhard Reitz, Lutheran missionary to New Guinea for five years, will speak at Faith Lutheran church at 8:30 p.m. Monday. He was accompanied by the Rev. John Briehl, pastor. The talk will be illustrated with colored slides taken in the mission field.

With his wife the Rev. Reitz went to New Guinea in 1946. Their two children, Phillip and Heidi, were born at Madang. The Reitzs will leave by plane from Portland Feb. 15 to serve a seven-year term in the same mission field.

During his year's furlough at home, the Rev. Reitz has spent his time lecturing and attending school in North Dakota and at Union Theological seminary in New York.
