

### Funeral Sunday For Melvin Hill

Funeral services were held Sunday for Melvin Stanley Hill, 44, who died last Thursday following a long illness. The Rev. Lloyd N. Pounds had charge of the services held at the Nyssa Funeral home. Interment was in Hillcrest cemetery.

Mr. Hill was born Oct. 7, 1908 at Maxwell, Neb. He was married Jan. 9, 1933 to Reverta Johns at North Platte, Neb. He engaged in missionary work at an early age and later conducted gospel work in Arkansas and later in Sidney, Neb. He attended a Bible school in Los Angeles and then moved with his family to Tucson, Ariz., where he engaged in contracting construction work. He also engaged in some gospel work during that time, until he was stricken with illness and confined to a hospital for nearly two years.

After Mr. Hill was released from the hospital in September, 1952, he came to Nyssa to the home of his

### Family Brawl Brings Possible Marihuana Find

A family brawl reported by neighbors early last Thursday morning resulted in the confiscation of a large quantity of what is believed to be marihuana, and the signed statement of a 20-year-old woman that the drug is being sold here, Acting Chief of Police David Gray reported. No arrests were made in the case, but an investigation is being made, he said.

Gray said that Officer Howard mother, Mrs. Emma Hall, and later to the home of his sister, Mrs. Milton J. Connelly.

Surviving are his wife, Reverta, eight children, his mother, one brother, Bernard, of Los Angeles; four sisters, Mrs. Frank Olson of North Platte, Mrs. Vernal Patterson, Mrs. Lloyd Pounds and Mrs. Milton J. Connelly, all of Nyssa. One son preceded him in passing.

Crawford investigated the reported "row" and found that the woman had been beaten, allegedly by her estranged husband. The pair were taken before Justice of the Peace Don M. Graham, but no charges were filed against the man. A doctor was called to treat the woman, who had a head concussion, Gray said, and she was told by the doctor to go home. The police said that the woman asserted she had no home and she and her two children were allowed to stay at the police station for the rest of the night.

A quantity of "weed" believed to be marihuana was taken near the residence of the woman and an investigation is being made to determine what action can be taken, the acting chief of police said.

On Thursday, the woman and her two children were taken to the welfare office in Ontario, but Gray reported that he was told that little help could be given because of the lack of funds. One of the youngsters, who became ill, was hospitalized there, Gray said.

The woman involved another man in the case, when she told police and signed the statement, that she had lived with a man at Marsing who had sold marihuana in Nyssa. Two names were used by the woman for the one man, officers said. A second woman appeared at the police station Saturday and signed a statement that the first woman's husband had beaten and kicked his wife and had pulled a knife on the second woman.

Gray said he expected to bring action against at least one of the persons involved within a few days.

The vote will be by ballot, upon which shall be the words "For tax levy—Yes" and "For tax levy—No," and the voter shall place a cross (x) between the words "For tax levy" and the word "Yes" or between the words "For tax levy" and the word "No," which indicates his choice.
