New Plymouth—The enrollment for the New Plymouth grade school has dropped under last year's figure while the high school enrollment is remaining about the same, according to school superintendent Arthur Hiemstra.
In the grade school 415 pupils are now attending school while the highest figure last year was 452. Hiemstra said that it was amazing and could not be explained readily just why the grade school enrollment went down this year while most other schools in the area reported an increase.
At the high school 191 students are attending classes which is only six under the 1952 figure for the high school—Payette Valley Sentinel.
