### 4th Straight Win By Bulldogs; Un-scored On In Three Games

Winning its fourth straight football game, three of them ending scoreless for their opponents, the Nyssa high school Bulldogs trampled the Ontario Tigers last Friday for a 13-0 score.

On the statistics side the Bulldogs showed too much power and alertness for the hapless Tigers. For instance, Nyssa made 155 yards from scrimmage to the Tigers' 78 and made nine first downs to the Tigers' six.

In the passing department, honors were more even. Nyssa tried 14 passes, completing 4 for 31 yards, while Ontario completed five out of 15 for 39 yards. At no time did the

Tigers get beyond Nyssa's 40-yard line.

Mentionable features of the hard-fought game were the outstanding punting feats of Gary Capps and Dan Lovejoy.

The Bulldogs first score came early in the first quarter, after being set up by a 78-yard dash to the Tigers' 15. Seconds later Elmer Pierce barged over from the one-yard line to score. Try for point failed.

In the later minutes of the fourth quarter Dave Savage carried the leather in two running plays from the 11-yard line across the Tigers' goal. Lovejoy's try for point was good—score, 13-0.
