FESTIVAL PROGRAM INCLUDES SPORTS, BARBECUE, BALL

assistance in the serving of the barbecue.

In the event of rain General Chairman Dick Yost said the sports events and barbecue will be held in the old school gym.

During the serving of the barbecue an air show will be in progress, staged by the 190th fighter squadron of Gowen field, Boise. Following this the Ontario unit of the Oregon state national guard will have on display and will give a demonstration of the operation of heavy artillery pieces which it uses. Lt. James Cables and Lt. Paul Hrai will be in command.

At 2 p. m. a free movie matinee will open at the Nyssa Theatre for children. A special film, "Cow Country", has been secured for this showing by Rex Voeller. Tickets for the free show can be secured from any Nyssa merchant without obligation, during the balance of the week.

The evening's program will begin with a free band concert at 8 p. m., with the Nyssa Municipal band providing the entertainment in the new high school gymnasium. Leon Burt will direct the 30-piece band.

Coronation of Harvest Queen
The Harvest Ball will start immediately after the band concert, at 9 p. m., to the music of Charles Stiefens' seven-piece dance orchestra.

The ball will be a semi-formal affair, according to Wilton Jackson, committee chairman, other members of his committee being Lew Herriman, Cliff Mink and Don Moss.

Highlights of the harvest ball will be harvest queen coronation ceremonies and the professional floor show.

Music for the ball is being provided by the produce companies of Nyssa.

State Senator Elmo Smith of John Day will officiate over the elaborate crowning ceremonies at 10 p. m., in which Sylvia Jayo, high school senior, will be proclaimed Queen Sylvia I, to reign over the 1953 Harvest Festival.

Queen Sylvia I's attendants will be Phyllis Cheideln, Betty Jean Strickland, Maryann Alford and Vela Dee Poulsen, fellow seniors.

R. V. Wilson, high school principal and a member of the queen committee, will be master of ceremonies for the coronation.

Other members of the queen committee are Fred Bracken, chairman, and Floyd Mackrill and Dillon Erickson.

Intermission Floor Show

Ken Bort of radio station KFXD, Nampa, will present a professional floor show of 12 numbers immediately following the queen coronation ceremonies. Featured entertainers will be Carolyn Patterson and Judy Volten, former Snake River Valley Stampede rodeo queens, who will render cowboy duet numbers, and Patty Smith in acrobatic and tap dance numbers.

The floor show program is being sponsored by the Amalgamated Sugar company, and was arranged by Jerry Flesey and Ralph Lawrence. Decorations for the harvest ball will be arranged by the Nyssa Junior Chamber of Commerce, under supervision of Ross Grover.

Other committees that are active in working out the details of the harvest festival are Hammy Chadderdon and Ed Boydell, prizes; Gene

Crasty, publicity, and Bernard Eastman budget.
