Judges to Select Best Oregon Dairy Products

Ending the best Oregon ice cream, milk, and other dairy products is the job facing five teams of experts on the Oregon State college campus this week. Judging will be completed February 13 and awards presented during the annual short course and convention of the Oregon Dairy Industries at the college, February 15 to 18.
Dr. G. H. Wilster, OSC professor of dairy manufacturing and conference chairman, says entries in butter, cheddar cheese, ice cream, cottage cheese, milk, and cream are being judged by representatives from industry, U. S. department of agriculture, and Oregon State college.
More than a dozen national authorities on dairy products are among speakers for the short course and convention. The Rev. Alcuin, Portland, will address the annual banquet, February 18. Father Heibel, president of the Central Europe Relief committee, recently returned from Germany where he spent several years organizing help for refugees.
