A farewell party is being held Monday evening at the Earl Ward home for them. They are moving to Michell Butte.

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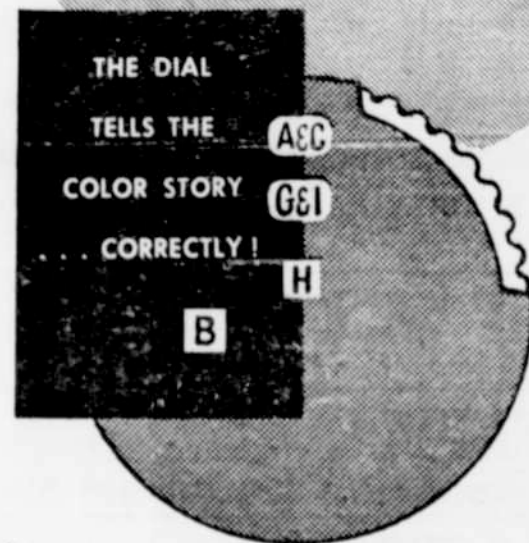
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
