Lutheran Church Special Services For Palm Sunday

The Lutheran church of Vale will hold a service of organization Sunday evening. The Rev. S. C. Siefkes, district president of the northwestern district of the American church, will preach the festival sermon and will call the new congregation officially into being.

These Palm Sunday services will be held at 8 p. m. at the Vale Methodist church and the regular Sunday services at 2 p. m. and 3 p. m. will be omitted for the special service.

The Rev. John L. Briehl, pastor of the Nyssa-Vale Lutheran parish, has conducted services in the Vale area for the past two years and nine months. During this time, officially known as the Vale Preaching Place, the Lutheran group will now become an organized congregation.

The public is invited to the special service and a social hour will follow.

Confirmation services will be held Palm Sunday morning at Faith Lutheran church, the Rev. John L. Briehl, pastor, announced. Following two years of instruction in the Word of God the confirmands will, through a public confession of their Christian faith and acceptance of Jesus Christ, be declared members of the Lutheran church.

The Rev. Briehl will preach the confirmation sermon, the sacrament of holy communion will be given and the Rev. S. C. Siefkes, district president of the northwestern district of the American Lutheran church will assist at the services. The public is invited to attend these services which begin at 11 a. m. Palm Sunday.
