Marina Svetlova, Prima Ballerina and her concert group will be presented by Malheur County Community Concert association as the final concert of the past year's series, April 14 at 8:15 p.m. in the Ontario high school auditorium.

This versatile group is America's favorite dance attraction. In eight transcontinental tours, they have given more than 500 performances. Perhaps the reason for this phenomenal success is that the beautiful Svetlova gives her audiences the best classical dance tradition and a wealth of humor, pantomime, dramatic action and visual splendor.

Born in Paris, she began dancing at the age of nine. She first brought Europe to her feet and then captured the world as star of the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo. She has danced seven seasons as Prima Ballerina of the Metropolitan Opera and has made guest appearances with the New York City Opera and famous dance festivals.

Because of her love for ballet and her eagerness to share its magic with as wide an audience as possible, Svetlova organized her own company so that she could bring its enchantment to concert hall audiences in as widespread an area as her operatic schedules would permit. Every year since 1944, she has toured with this group which is composed of herself, Jack Beaver, a leading maldancer; Bolovia, a fiery young Spanish dancer and Theodor Haig concert pianist.

Birthday cake and ice cream were served the guests.

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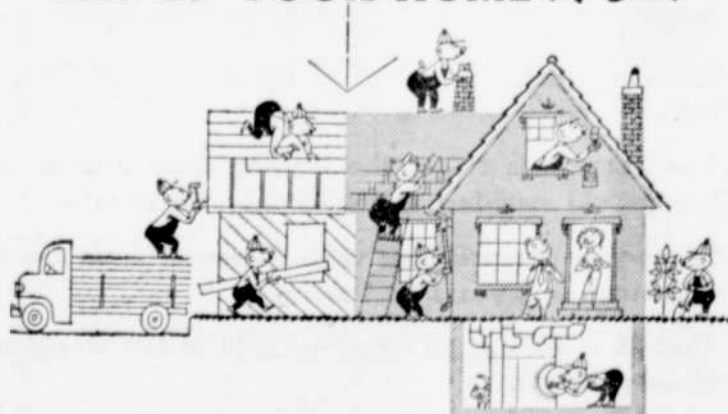
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
