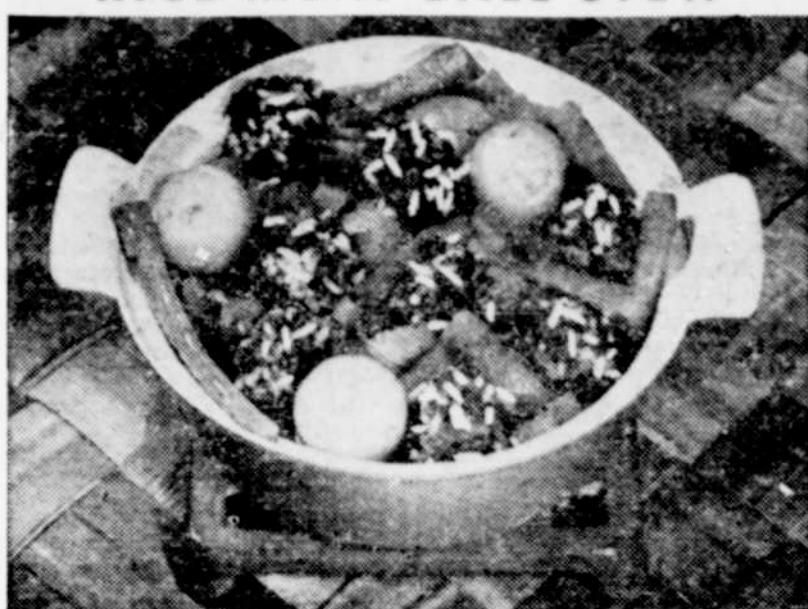

RICE MEAT BALL STEW



- 1 pound ground beef
- ¼ cup uncooked rice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon pepper
- 2 tablespoons minced parsley
- 2 tablespoons shortening
- 1 clove garlic
- 2 cups beef stock or salted water
- 2 medium-sized turnips, diced
- 6 small onions
- 2 cups coarsely diced celery
- 6 small carrots, quartered
- 3 tablespoons flour

Combine beef, uncooked rice, salt, pepper and parsley, and form

into 18 small balls. Melt shortening in dutch oven. Split clove of garlic and add to heated shortening. Add meat balls and brown lightly. Remove garlic. Drain excess fat from meat balls and reserve 3 tablespoons for use later.

Pour stock over meat balls. Bring to a rapid boil. Lower heat. Cover and simmer 20 minutes. Add vegetables and simmer about 35 minutes longer, or until vegetables and visible rice are tender. To reserved fat, stir in flour until smooth. Add to stew and simmer 5 to 10 minutes longer. Yield: 6 servings.
