NEIGHBORING TOWN TOPICS

Payette—Police Chief Cecil Fetter Monday evening announced his resignation as the city's head law enforcement officer in a move which took some members of the Payette city council completely by surprise.—Independent-Enterprise.

Emmett—A special meeting of the city council will be held Monday night to discuss a proposal to call a bond election for the purpose of financing a swimming pool in Emmett. The action came Monday night after the council received a petition from the Swimming Pool Association asking them to call a special bond election for the purpose. The petition information cited that costs of the project would be approximately \$65,000.—Index.

Payette—Fruit growers and packers estimated last night that approximately 50 percent of the Payette county prune crop has been wiped out by freezing weather of the past week, it was reported from the USDA station at Fruitland.—Independent-Enterprise.

Vale—Four-year-old Claudia Hoffman was saved from possible drowning in an irrigation ditch on the Leonard Jacobson farm Sunday by her cousin, Jay Phillips II, eight years old. Both children are from Ontario.—Malheur Enterprise.

Ontario—Jerry Cloninger of Caldwell shot a 143 for 54 holes to win the annual Ontario open golf tourney held here Sunday. He won a valuable contour chair or its equivalent in some other merchandise. Cloninger, a student at the University of Oregon, has won several Idaho Tournament.

George Beechler of Ontario and Newt Carter of Boise, defending champion, tied for second place with a score 146. Beechler won the play off match. He was awarded an alligator traveling bag and Carter, a Schaffer pen and pencil set.—Argus-Observer.

Baker — After allocating additional funds to the general road fund to meet increased materials cost under the county's current special road construction program and allowing \$5000 to carry on when the federal government warned it was withdrawing from full support for livestock disease control work, the Baker county budget committee Tuesday wrote a \$503,956.20 budget for 1954-55.

The budget will be met within the six percent limitation and without special taxes, County Judge Lloyd Rea said today.—Record-Courier
