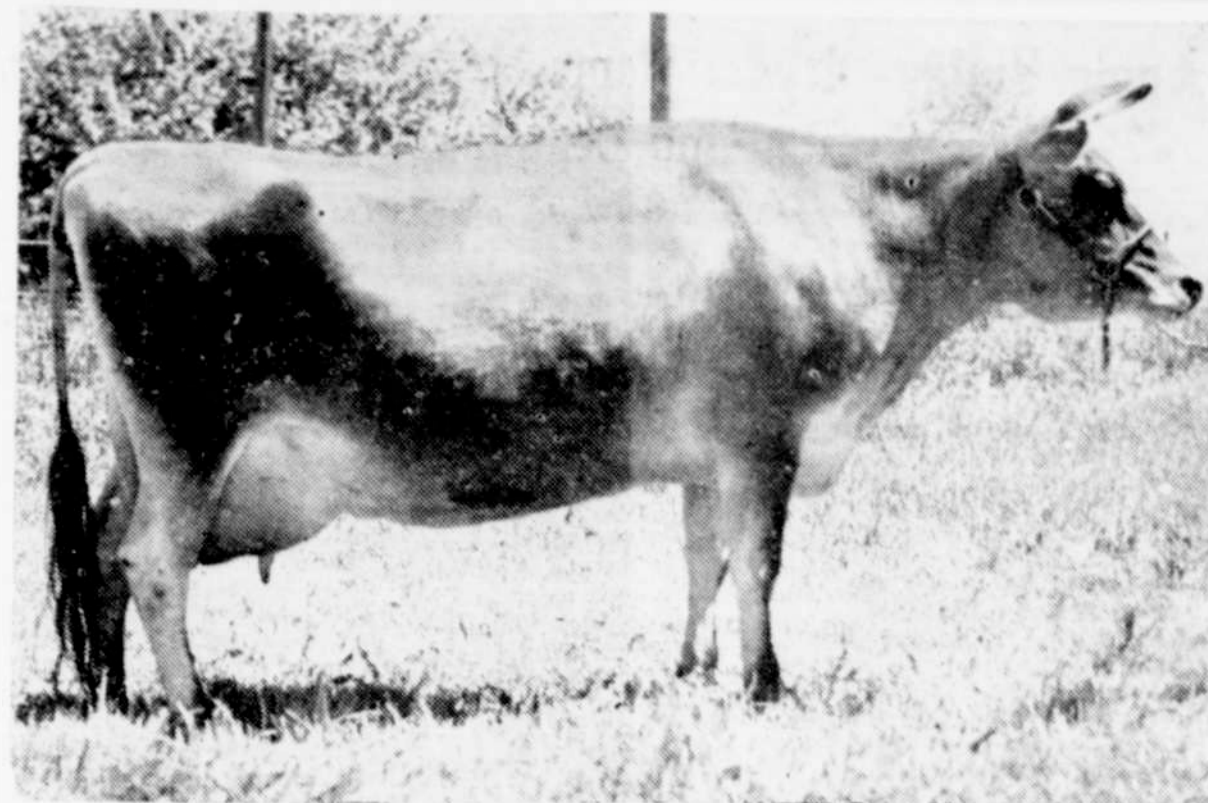

SYBIL GAMBOGE PRETTY Polly, owned by Hope and Charley Grider, is queen of the ninth annual Spring Jersey Show set for Saturday at Nyssa. The queen has a total production of 1,931 pounds of butterfat and 36,804 pounds of milk to her trophy given by Tobler's Feed & Fuel. Her milk

production averaged 40.2 lbs. a day for the 915 days considered in competition. Classified very good for type, Polly has won several silver medals, two gold medals and a ton of gold award from the American Jersey Cattle club. She has produced a total of 2,755 pounds of butterfat in her five com-

pleted lactations. Her three-year record of 579.9 pounds of fat won her the honor of production princess at the 1950 Spring Jersey Show. She won her first blue ribbon as a senior yearling and has won blue and purple ribbons at each show since then, and is three-times winner of the best udder class.

Ralph Castator, Wife Injured

Condition of Ralph Castator, Parma route 2, was reported satisfactory Wednesday at the Malheur Memorial hospital where he is recovering from injuries received in a Sunday wreck three miles south of Fruitland on highway 95. He was treated for a fractured jaw and leg and numerous contusions. Mrs. Castator, who was with him at the time of the accident, was admitted to the hospital for treatment and was released Tuesday. A son, John, was in the car, but was not in-

jured seriously enough for hospitalization.

Idaho officers reported that Castator was driving north and attempted to pass a car driven by Louie Attebery of Nyssa, just as the latter started to make a left turn from the highway. The Castator car was forced into a ditch after it hit the side of the other vehicle. No one in the Attebery car was hurt, according to reports. Castator, a resident of the Apple Valley community and a registered pharmacist, is well known in Nyssa, serving as relief pharmacist at both Nyssa drug stores.

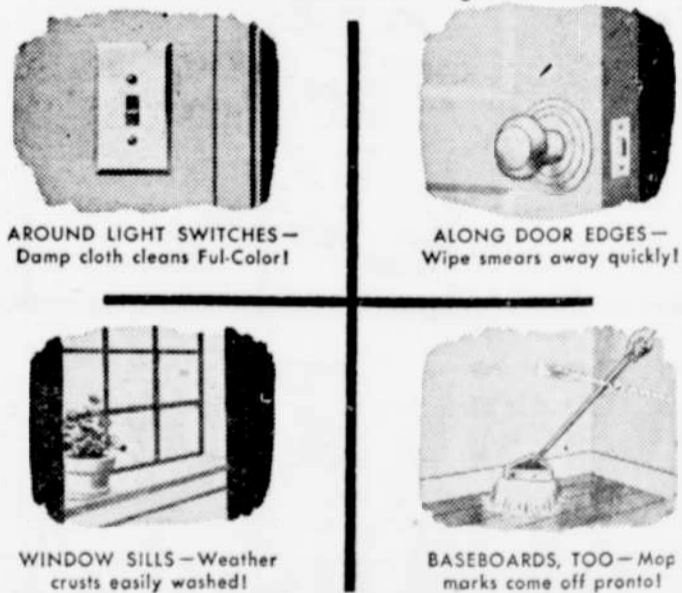
