Mr. and Mrs. Maylin Maxfield returned Sunday from Sun Valley after spending five days attending the Idaho Shippers Convention.

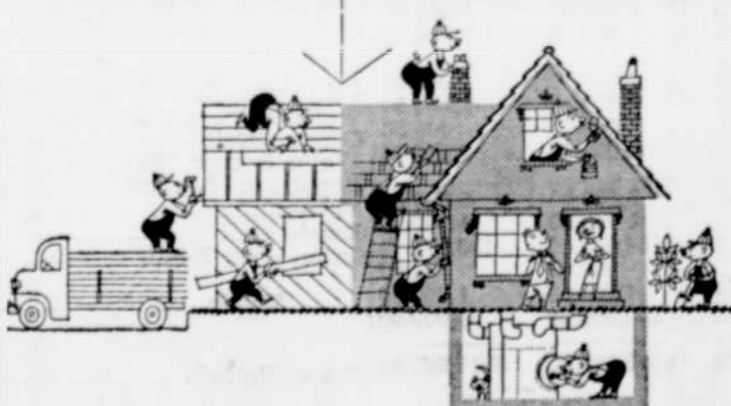

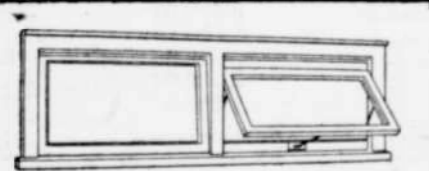

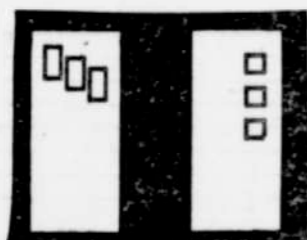
