Vanilla Wafers or other Cookies

**Easy Lemon Sherbet**  
(Makes about 2 quarts)

1½ cups (large can) undiluted Carnation Evaporated Milk  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
½ cup granulated sugar  
1 6-ounce can frozen lemonade

Chill Carnation in refrigerator tray until soft crystals form around edges of tray (20-25 minutes). Whip until stiff (about 1-2 minutes). Add lemon juice and whip until very stiff (about 2 minutes longer). Fold in granulated sugar and softened lemonade. Freeze in refrigerator tray until firm, stirring occasionally.
