presented combining health, educational, religious and comedy features with heavy emphasis being placed on health and hygiene. This program was initiated by the Rev. Reyes at a camp mass meeting June 13 at which time he strongly appealed to the camp residents to consider a clean-up program. The results have been highly encouraging with a majority of the residents cooperating. To stimulate interest, Bill Shambaugh, camp director, is offering a prize for the neatest cabin.

Among local residents who have responded to the call for volunteers services in the activities are Catherine Coleman, Phyllis Fox, Mardell Thompson and the Latin-American club representative, Mrs. Maggie Diaz. Three high school teachers, Mrs. Charles Steffens, Soren Cox and Louie Attebery, have volunteered to conduct English classes, thus fulfilling a long-standing need. The Nyssa school district through Supt. Henry H. Hartley, is cooperating in these educational efforts wherever possible.
