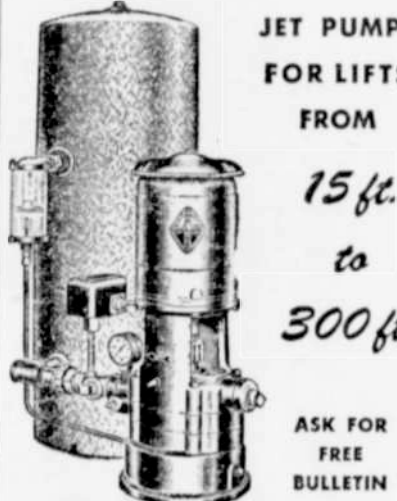


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Old Timers Join To Recall Early Days In Big Bend

Big Bend—A reunion was held Thursday afternoon on the lawn of the home of Mr. and Mrs. Frank A. Miller, when 64 former and later members of Wade PTA met for a social gathering.

Wade school was built in 1905 when a few families moved in having the required number of children to open a school. At that time most of the land had been taken as homesteads and did not pay taxes, but the few who did borrowed \$1000 from the state at 6 percent interest and built a one-room school house with just the necessary equipment to open school.

That fall the first social organization was formed to raise money to buy additional equipment for the building. The first was kerosene lamps. The next a large flag, a bell, an organ, and later a piano, reference books, a large dictionary, charts, maps, pictures, bookcases, a stove, dishes and other equipment for social affairs. The first society was called the "Social Circle" which was very active until the first World War, when attention was turned to Red Cross work, after which the PTA movement was brought to the state and a local unit was started in the Bend and later joined the county organization.

Thursday no program was planned but members of over 50 years recalled and talked of their children who are now grandparents, whose early lives and future success had a firm foundation from training of their interested teachers and parents. After visiting, pictures of groups were taken. Those of 50 years or more, then 40 years, 30 years, 20 years and ten.

The afternoon session closed with all being served a cold drink and cookies. The group thanked the Millers for the hospitality of their home and Mrs. Ruby English and Mrs. Goldie Roberts for planning the event.

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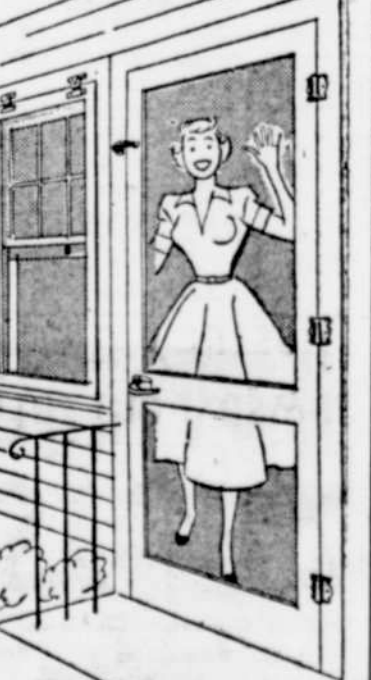


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
