

Postmaster Goes To First Meeting For New District

Postmaster Lloyd Lewis attended the first district meeting of postmasters and supervisors under the new post office reorganization plan last Thursday evening in Ontario. Eight counties in Eastern Oregon and Western Idaho were represented at the meeting.

James C. Leighton, district manager, spoke on the new system of setting up districts to handle problems on an area basis. His assistant, a Mr. Stansbury, reviewed the need for reorganization that was recommended 45 years ago and did not take place until this year. This district's post offices will be served from Portland through the district manager instead of directly from Washington, D. C., it was explained.

The main goal is to establish closer contact with individual offices, speed up solution of problems and operate on the needs and situations as they exist and not by precedent, the postmasters were told.

A training program for all post office employees may be instituted in connection with the program for better service and full consideration of the public's desires, Lewis said.
