Sen. Wayne Morris Speaks In County

Sen. Wayne Morris, Oregon Independent, was speaker Monday night at a Malheur county Democratic committee sponsored meeting at Boulevard Grange hall.

Sen. Morris came here to urge the election of Democratic candidates, Richard C. Neuberger, for U. S. senator, and Albert Ullman, for congressman. The independent senator also indicated that he will be a candidate to succeed himself in 1956 and gave numerous reasons for resigning from the Republican party.

He stated that cuts in farm support prices are causing economic difficulties and asserted that food surpluses are necessary for a strong nation. Morris outlined his ideas of a plan to provide food for India and other friendly nations to raise the standard of living in those countries.

"We feel it was more vandalism than thievery," said Mrs. John Palmer. The Palmer home was entered and ransacked recently.

"It was partially our own fault," she said, "as the house was unlocked. However, we had never had trouble of that kind before."

Mrs. Palmer said the only object stolen was a hunting knife, but that acts of vandalism were numerous.

"A bottle of ink was tipped over and spilt, the stock was broken from a deer rifle, a window was broken, a sack of carrots removed from the refrigerator, flies and plugs and other fishing equipment were strewn all over the lawn... that sort of thing," she added.

Two boys did the entry. One was 8; the other 6. They also entered the homes of neighbors and later threatened another little boy with the knife they had stolen. Mrs. Palmer said.
