Tossy Spivkovsky, Violinist To Be Guest Monday

Tossy Spivkovsky, world-famed violin virtuoso, will provide entertainment for the second program in this season's series of concerts for members of the Malheur County community concert associations. Tossy will appear in the Ontario high school auditorium Monday, Jan. 17 at 8:15 p.m.

Few soloists on the American concert stage today have been more favorably received than Spivkovsky. Because of his blazing technique and warmly personal approach to the art of playing the violin, the critics themselves have been taxed to express themselves at their best.

Born in Russia, Spivkovsky was taken at the age of two to Berlin where he made his debut at ten as an wunderkind, and grew to musical maturity in the German capitol between the two wars.

The rise of Hitler sent the artist, already a recording and concert artist of considerable repute to Australia, where he later married. From his first appearance in America in 1943, he rapidly rose to fame and has since appeared in all 48 states as well as many countries abroad.

Between tours, Spivkovsky lives quietly with his wife and 14 year old daughter in their farmhouse in Wilton, Conn.

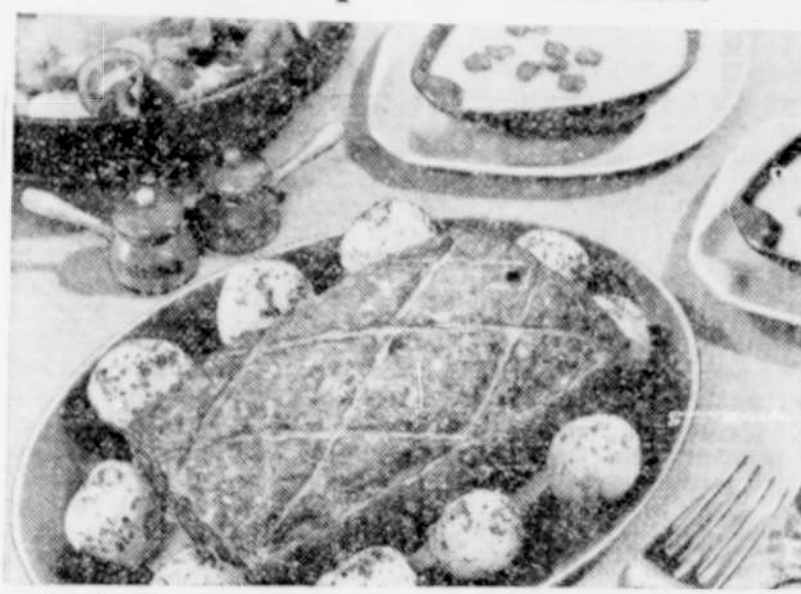

Cure Budget Jitters With Inexpensive Meat Loaf



'Round about this time every year bills are pouring in, and the food budget is suffering a slight attack of anemia. The result, of course . . . Mrs. Homemaker is left draining her brain of ideas for serving inexpensive meals that still remain hearty and fine tasting.

No one will deny that meat loaf is a standby during these days and here's a really good recipe for one that furnishes extra nourishment with the addition of the cereal favorite . . . 40% bran flakes.

Start off the meal, why don't you, with a good hot soup. Then on the meat loaf platter add parsley potatoes and serve with large quantities of mixed green salad. Plenty of hot coffee (milk for the kids) will be welcome along with a simple dessert. No one will ever guess the pocketbook is "broke" if you don't mention it.

Savory Meat Loaf

1 1/2 tablespoons diced salt pork or bacon
1/4 cup finely chopped onion
2 pounds ground beef
2 teaspoons salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 1/2 cups crushed canned tomatoes
1 cup 40% bran flakes

Fry salt pork or bacon with the onion until the meat is crisp and the onion is golden brown. Combine with other ingredients and mix thoroughly. Pack into 10 x 5 x 3-inch loaf pan. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) 1 hour, or until done. Serve hot or cold. Garnish with parsley. Makes 8 to 12 servings.

Note: If desired, add 1/2 cup drained cooked peas to the meat mixture and mix lightly.

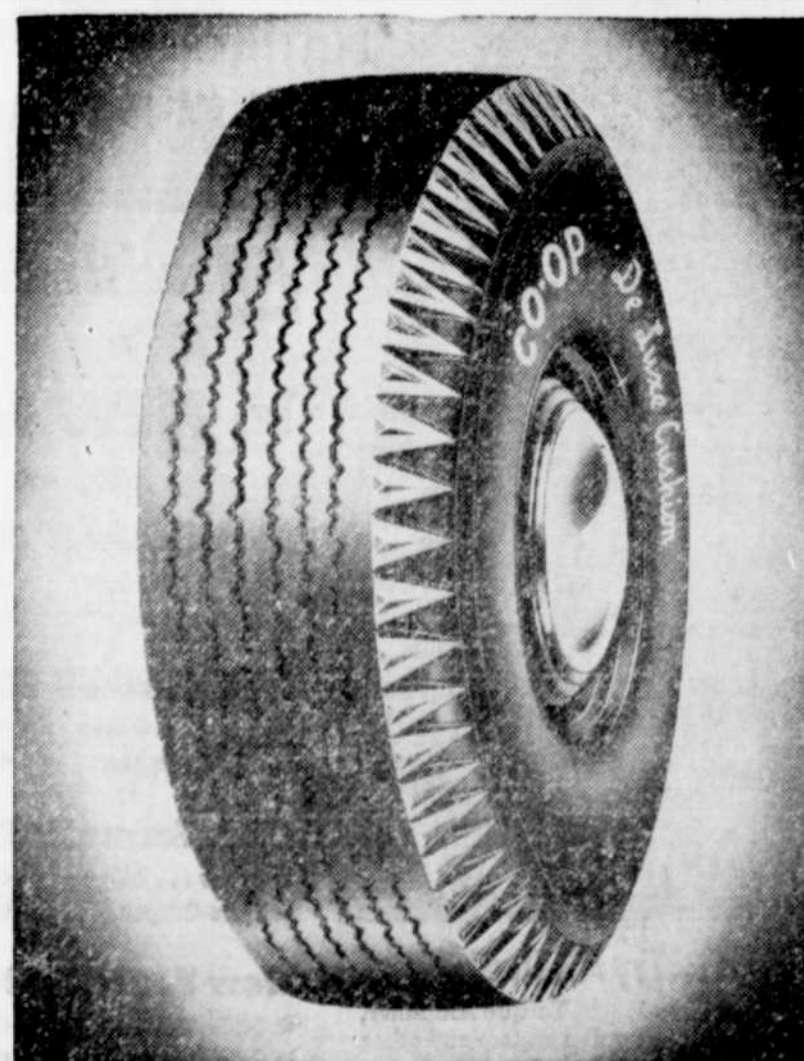
