

### City Library Has New List of Ten Varied Books

Mrs. Desmond Jones, city librarian, announced the addition of 10 new books to the Nyssa public library. The new books, their authors and a brief description are:

The Blue Hurricane by Van Wyck Mason. The personal problems of Matt Hovey, respected young resident of a Main village, drive him westward and into the river engagements between North and South on the Ohio, the Tennessee and the Mississippi.

Variable winds at Jalna by Mazo La Roche. Another year at Jalna brings further developments in events chronicled in Renny's daughter.

Katherine by Anya Seton. This is the true and hitherto untold story of John Gaunt, the great Duke of Lancaster and Katherine Swynford and of their love which changed English history.

The Searchers by Alan LeMay. This story concerns the fracture line, west of the cross timbers between the frontier Texans and the Comanches, just after the Civil War.

The View from Pompey's Head by Hamilton Basso. Encompassing a sweep of contemporary society that ranges from the worlds of law and publishing in Manhattan to a detailed examination of life in a small southern city. A young lawyer, after an absence of 15 years, finds it necessary to return to his home of Pompey's Head on a singularly curious mission.

Perilous Journeys of Hercules Poirot by Agatha Christie. Including the mystery of the Blue train, death on the Nile and murder in Mesopotamia.

The Benevolent Treasure by Patricia Wentworth. Young Candida Sayle could well be thankful that Miss Silver was in the neighborhood when she went to visit two great-aunts in their fabulous old Elizabethan house. These two sweet old ladies, it turned out, were the very two who had sent Candida on the nearly fatal walk on the tidal flats over five years before.

The Tortoise and the Hare by Elizabeth Jenkins. An English wife finds herself in the unenviable position of competing for her husband's favor with an older, physically less attractive woman, and relegated to the status nuisance in the eyes of her son. Deft characterization, humor, and tolerance mark the author's handling of human relationships and enhance the element of suspense, of feminine appeal.

Third Daughter by Allie D. Hennagin. Journey to the promised land where they would take their land claim. It was hard for Pa to have three daughters and no sons old enough to help him, for Patrick was only eight and Timmy was still a baby. But what could a 17 year-old girl do to earn money in Oregon in the 1860s?

The Complete Book of Helicopters by D. N. Ahnstrom.

### Your Library

An assortment of novels and non-fiction, both readable and informational, will go into circulation on Saturday, Feb. 5, at the Malheur County Library.

High Jinks on the Klondike by Richard O'Conner tells of the miners and those who followed them North but who found more comfortable ways to get rich in the days of the fabulous gold rush of 1897.

William L. Shirer turns to fiction with his recent book, *Strange Come Home*, which tells of a veteran foreign correspondent who returns to the U. S. as a radio commentator, and in upholding democratic principles meets head-on the political pressures of the day.

The Best from Fantasy and Science Fiction is the third year anthology of selected stories from the magazine.

Lois Henderson describes personal experiences with her child who was born blind and his adjustment to a sightless world during his first eight years in her book, *The Opening Doors*.

In her new novel, *Brave Pursuit*, Marguerite Allis continues the Field family saga begun in "Now We Are Free" and "To Keep Us Free," telling of Connie Field's striving for an education.

A one-volume edition of Carl Sandburg's "The Prairie Years" and "The War Years" incorporates recent material made available and uses the title *Abraham Lincoln: The Prairie Years and The War Years*.

Successful Photography by Andreas Feininger is an exhaustive treatment of basic principles for the "serious amateur."

A probation officer, Paul Keve, recounts details of actual cases he has handled in Prison, Probation, or Parole?

A handful of Silver by Victor Canning is a novel about a young British schoolmaster with a background in wartime intelligence work who is sent on a secret mission to the French Pyrenees.

Nevil Shute Norway, a well known novelist, relates his life as an aeronautical engineer in *Slide Rule*.

Solomon and the Queen of Sheba is a Biblical novel by Czesni Ormonde.

The Dream and the Desert by Uys Krige, a South African writer, contains eight short stories and a one-act play. His first story in English (he writes in Afrikaans), "The death of a Zulu," appeared in "Harper's" in 1950.

A definite biography of a nineteenth century figure whose art criticism and political ideas influenced his generation, John Ruskin by Joan Evans makes use of new materials gleaned largely from his diaries.

A mystery by the writing team, Richard and Frances Lockridge, called *Death and the Gentle Bull* begins with Captain Heimrich's skepticism over the claim that a gentle Aberdeen Angus had trampled his owner to death.

The Woman Within is the autobiography of Ellen Glasgow; it emphasizes the inner agony that found expression in her novels.

Eight years of adventure with Congo pigmies is the subject of *Madami* by Anne Eisner Putnam.

A Norwegian explorer, Helge Marcus Ingstad, studies the inland Eskimos of Alaska and describes their hunting methods, housing, and eating in *Nunamit*.

The Love Letters of Phyllis McGinley is a collection of light verse.

Jonathan Blair: *Bounty Lands* Lawyer is a new novel by Will-

iam Ellis; author of *The Bounty Lands*, carrying on the story of the post-Revolutionary frontier.

*My Several Worlds* by Pearl Buck is the author's life story, a large part of which includes a social and political description of China where she was brought up, the daughter of missionary parents, and lived for forty years.

*Respectable Women* is a novel of Kansas in the 1890's by Gilbert Rees, the story of a mother and daughter each of whom had to tame a husband.

*Harvest of the Heart* by May Mellinger is the story of a young woman who builds a new life and a new love for herself following a personal tragedy.

Favorite prayers of all denominations for every occasion are found in *Donald Aldrich's The Golden Book of Prayer*.

County School Administration by Shirley Cooper and Charles Fitzwater is a general study of principles and practices of organization.

### Oregon Compiles List Of Fruit Plantings

A list of tested and indexed trees of varieties of sweet and sour cherries and prunes for use of nurseries has been supplied to Oregon nurserymen who grow stone tree fruit trees.

The state department of agriculture has done this to help nurserymen in the program to keep plantings free of virus diseases and to provide the information on scion and propagation stock that will fit into this purpose. Dr. Julius Heinis, pathologist, and R. P. Hemmerling, nursery inspector, both with the department, have compiled the list in cooperation with Dr. J. A. Milbrath of the state college experiment station.

The sources contained in the list are largely virus-free selections. A few contain a mild form of virus not considered of importance at this time.

The recommendations include propagation material for all pop-

ular varieties of sweet cherries and also for two new varieties, the Van and the Sam.

At the same time the state agencies are recommending these selections to the nurserymen of the state, the college extension service is making the same variety recommendations to orchardists.

The department of agriculture nursery service is urging all nurserymen who introduce new varieties or selections to keep the department informed. It also suggests that any nurseryman who is interested in growing these selections and has not received the list contact the Salem or Portland office of the department for a copy.
