The Ontario Tigers will not go to the state class A basketball tournament at Eugene next week due to their loss Monday evening on the Nyssa floor to the Baker Bulldogs, 59-56.

In the nip and tuck battle Ontario had a three point edge with just 1:56 left on the clock when they called time out. When play was resumed, Milton of Baker scored on a driving lay-in after he had stolen the ball from an Ontario player, to erase the Tigers' lead to one point. Another full court press proved effective for the Bulldogs as Hunt, a sophomore guard, scored another two-pointer after another stolen ball to put the Baker squad ahead 55-54. Hunt decided the game for the Bulldogs as he calmly canned 4 straight throws to put the game on ice for Baker.

Ontario forward, Earl Doman took individual scoring honors for the evening with 7 from the floor, and 1 from the charity line for 15 points for the losers. For the winners it was Oliver McCord and Gary Milton who twice put the winners out in front in the first and third quarters with his long one handers from way out.
