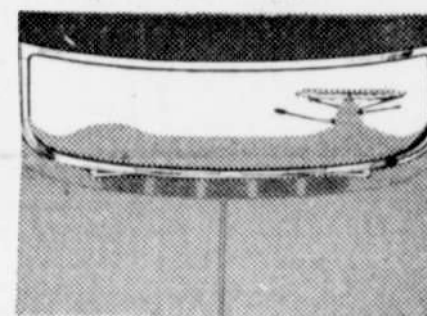

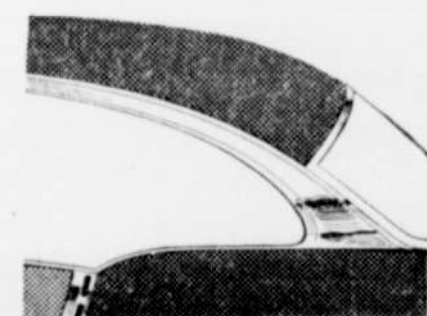

2 Louvered High-Level air intake



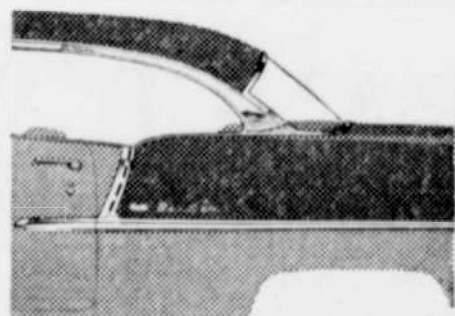
