Antelope Census Completed For Malheur County

Figures released following the annual spring antelope census for Malheur county indicates that there is a slight decrease in antelope numbers over the previous year.

In an aerial survey, there were 1100 animals observed in an area where 1200 were counted last spring, according to a report from Cecil Langdon, Malheur county district game agent. The census is taken each spring while the antelope are in bunches, enabling a more accurate tabulation, Langdon commented. Instead of attempting to count all animals within the county, the most suitable areas are covered quite thoroughly.

An estimated one-half of the antelope are found in the area southeast of Rome in the Bowden Hills, area, the survey revealed. However, some antelope are found in almost all sections of the county, with small groups close to the valley in the Harper, Juntura, Jordan Valley, Vale and Brogan areas.
