High School Poll Shows Trend For Lower Voting Age

A poll was recently taken of nearly 6,000 students and over 600 teachers throughout Oregon to determine the sentiment toward lowering the voting age to 18 as contained in bill presented before the legislature. Senator Mark Hatfield conducted the poll which resulted in response from 67 schools.

Of the 5,939 students reporting there were 61 1/2 percent in favor of lowering the voting age and 38 1/2 percent opposed and of the 610 faculty members responding 53 percent were in favor of the measure and 47 percent opposed.

There were 24 schools who sent percentage reports only. Of this group students averaged 80 percent in favor and 20 percent against with faculty indicating 51 percent for and 49 percent in opposition. In 16 schools percentage reports were sent for junior and senior classes only and resulted in junior statistics, 62 percent for and 38 percent against while the senior figures were closely comparable at 65 percent in favor and 35 percent opposed.
