## Nyssa Thinclads Lead SRV Relays

The thinclads of the Nyssa high school track squad scored an impressive 40 points at the SRV relays at Ontario to best all other competition by 13 points.

Other teams which placed in the meet were Ontario with 27½, Weiser 15, Emmett 14½, Meridian 11, and Vale coming up last with 10 points.

All the events were entered by three men from the various schools in the field events, with four men eligible for the runs. The winners were determined on a basis of total distance or combined time.

## Decrease Noted in Spring Pheasant Census for Area

The pheasant population has decreased in Malheur county and the cock to hen ratio is lower this year, according to Cecil Langdon, district game agent who has just completed the spring pheasant census for this county.

Last year's census showed 46 pheasants per 100 acres of suitable habitat and this year's count indicated 41 pheasants for the same area. The average cock to hen ratio this year is one cock to eight hens as compared to one cock to four and one-half hens tallied last year.

The census also indicated a decrease in the bob white quail, a small increase in the valley quail and the hungarian partridge population is about the same as last year. Thirty-nine samples totaling 100 miles were taken on foot by game commission employees for the survey.

No census was attempted for the chukar partridge, Langdon reported, but birds have been seen in most areas where they have been liberated during the past two years. This spring 300 mature chukars were liberated in the Westfall and Riverside areas.
