HAM ROLLS with macaroni stuffing
(Makes 6 servings)
2 tablespoons chopped onion
2 tablespoons butter
1 cup bread crumbs
1/2 cup undiluted Carnation Evaporated Milk
2 teaspoons prepared mustard
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
2 cups cooked macaroni
2 tablespoons chopped parsley
2 1/2" thick ham slices
Brown onion in butter in heavy skillet. Add crumbs and Carnation from heat, add seasonings, macaroni and parsley. Remove of macaroni mixture in center of each ham slice. Overlap ham ends and fasten with skewer or tooth picks. Place in shallow baking pan and bake in moderate oven (350° F) about 30-40 minutes. Serve with mustard or horseradish sauce.
