The 65-voice A Cappella choir of the Brigham Young University, under the direction of Professor Newell B. Weight, will present a varied and enriching musical program Saturday May 7, in Ontario, while on its annual tour which this year takes them to the Northwestern states. With a repertoire of early sacred music as well as folk songs and contemporary works, this ensemble has been regarded by many critics as one of the finest collegiate choirs in the nation.

Prof. Weight has been director of the choir since its organization in 1949. A native of Springville, Utah, he has studied choral techniques with Olaf Christensen, director of the famous St. Olaf choir of Minnesota. Since coming to BYU to organize and direct the A Cappella choir, Professor Weight has won the enthusiastic approval of the members by training them so skillfully in all the intricate, enacting phases of unaccompanied singing.
