CALL FOR CONSTRUCTION BIDS

Notice is hereby given that the District School Board of School District No. 1 - Malheur County, Oregon, intends to receive written sealed bids for the construction of a new two class room elementary school for and within said district. Such bids will be received by filing with the District School Clerk of said District, Mrs. Ethel R. Jones, Brogan, Oregon, on or before and until 8 p. m., Mountain Standard Time, July 5, 1955.

Such bids shall be so filed in a sealed envelope marked "Construction Bid" and will not be opened prior to the aforesaid time and date. All bids shall be made on bid forms provided and shall be accompanied by a bid bond or certified check in the amount of 5% of the base bid. At said time and date and at the school house of said district in Brogan, Oregon, the said District School Board of said District shall meet and publicly open all bids filed.

The said Board shall not consider any bid which does not fully comply with the terms and conditions fixed by this Notice. The said Board may postpone final consideration of the bids to some other time and place, or reject all bids and call for new bids in the manner required for original bids. If the said Board neither postpones nor rejects, the Board shall award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder, taking into consideration quality and probability of performance.

No bidder may withdraw his bid after the hour set for the opening thereof or before award of the contract unless said award is delayed for a period exceeding 30 days.

All work shall be awarded under one general contract. The general contractor and his subcontractors shall comply with all contractor's license laws, building codes and laws and statutes which apply to public work in the State of Oregon. Plans and specifications and contract documents are required and the same are incorporated herein as if specifically herein set out, by reference to the public office where the same are on file and subject to examination: the office of the County School Superintendent of Malheur County, Oregon, William E. Leggett, Malheur County Court House, Vale, Oregon. A set of said documents may be obtained at the office of the architect, Harold G. Thompson, 6001 Fairview Avenue, Boise, Idaho, upon a deposit of \$15.00. The plan deposit will be returned to actual bidders, providing drawings and specifications are returned in good condition within 14 days after bid opening.
