Mr. and Mrs. Walter Looney and Mr. and Mrs. Owen Gann are planning to fish and camp at the North Fork over the July Fourth week end.

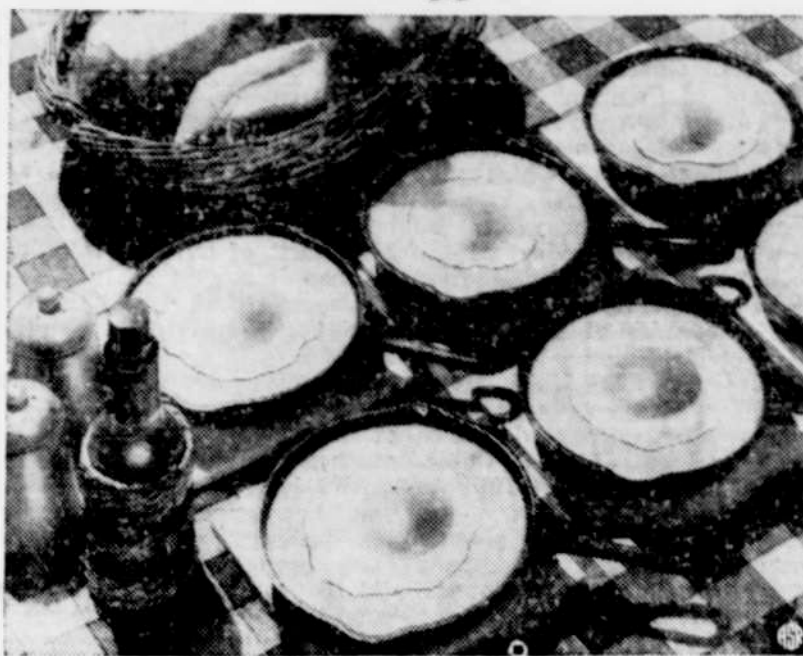

Tabasco Heightens Flavor In Egg Dishes

Checking the prices in food advertisements leaves no doubt about the fact that eggs are one of our best buys during these Lenten weeks, and one of our most useful sources of protein right now. Eggs are versatile for any of the three meals, and can do dinner duty in place of meat frequently with a little imagination in the way they are seasoned and served.

One of the easiest seasonings to use with eggs is Tabasco, the pungent liquid pepper seasoning. Gourmets have used a few drops with boiled or poached eggs for years, and good cooks picked up the hint from them and add it to other egg dishes, such as scrambled eggs and egg Goldenrod. Here is a recipe for an egg dish that will prove not only filling, but tasty enough to make the lack of meat in a meal go unnoticed!

Tabasco Baked Eggs
3 tablespoons butter or margarine
3 tablespoons flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon prepared mustard
1 1/2 cups milk
1 1/2 cups grated American cheese
1/4 teaspoon Tabasco
6 or 12 eggs

Melt butter; blend in flour and seasonings. Add milk and cook, stirring constantly until mixture thickens and comes to a boil. Remove from heat; add grated cheese, stirring occasionally until cheese is melted. Divide sauce into 6 individual baking dishes. Break 1 or 2 eggs into each dish. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) until eggs are set, about 12 minutes.

YIELD: 6 servings.

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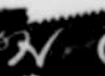
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
