Dwight Wyckoff, for the past four years vocational agriculture instructor for Nyssa public school district 26-C, announced his resignation July 1 to enter private business.

Wyckoff has become affiliated with Tobler's Feed and Fuel, Inc., as a farm advisor on the feeding of poultry and livestock and as a field salesman. He will write a column on feeding problems, the first of which will be found on another page of this week's Journal.

Wyckoff is widely known in educational circles and is a past president of the Nyssa Educational association. Last year he was chosen as a delegate to the National Educational association convention in New York.

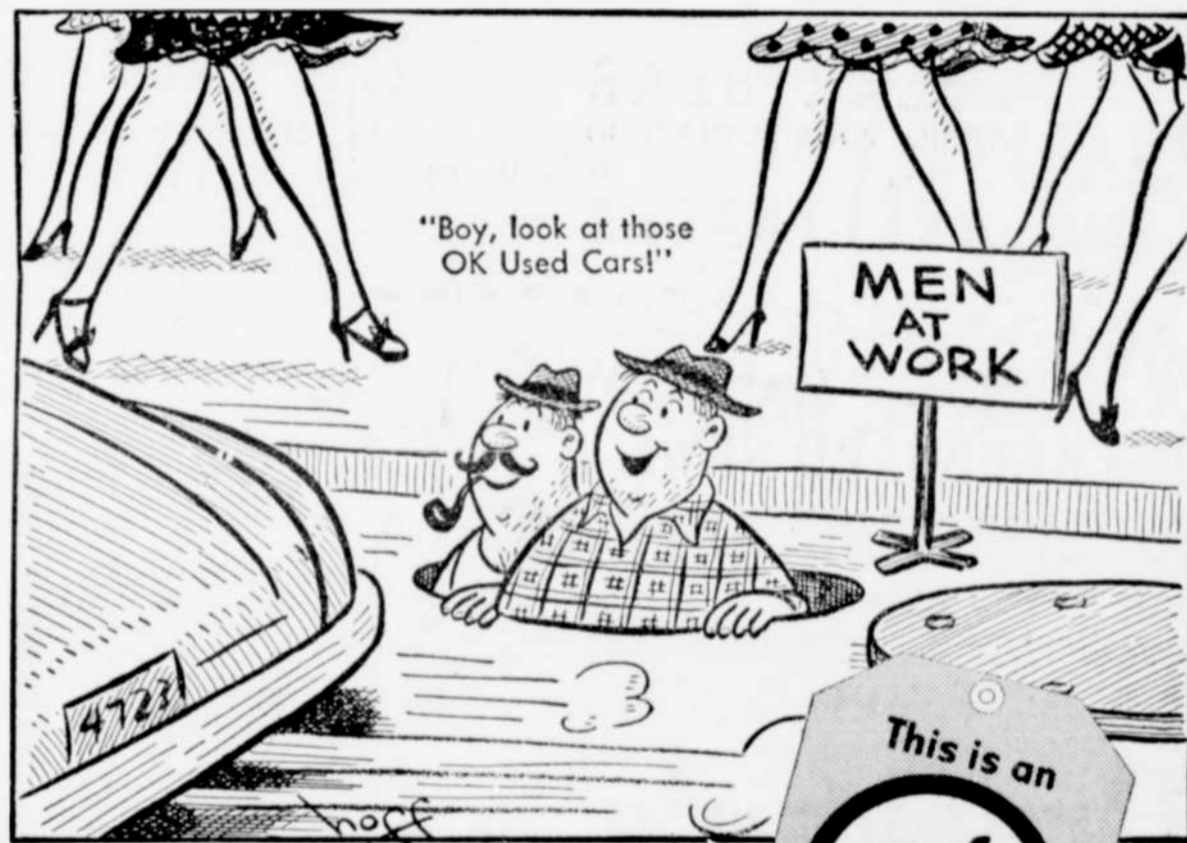
