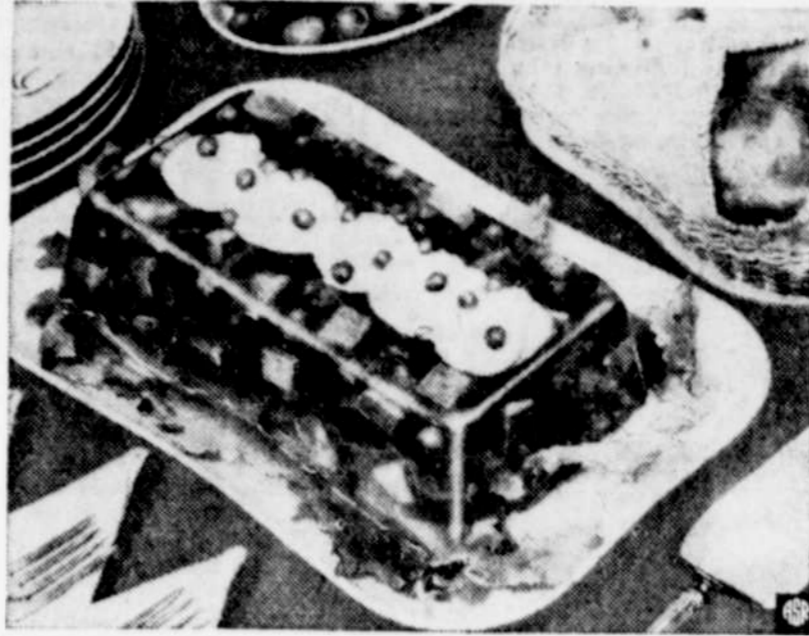
Attend Birthday Party
