At last Thursday evening's regular meeting of Oregon Trail Grange George Cleaver, agricultural chairman, reported that the ACP will discontinue practice of weed control and suggested that some means should be found to fight noxious weeds.

LeRoy Herrman read an article by D. E. Anderson, dairy specialist, which stated that dairy surpluses are down and the government has reduced its purchases. A sales program was credited with increased sales of the product.

Alva Goodell, legislative chairman, told of a courthouse report and that the county will hire a juvenile officer. He also reported that the Vale community has given its hospital building to the county for an old folks home.

Frank Parr read an article about governmental affairs which included a discussion of congressional pay and told of the farm situation. It stated that prices farmers receive have decreased while supplies and other expenses are increasing. LeRoy Herrman stated that farmers' incomes are down 21 percent.

A letter of appreciation was read from Garnet Ritchie who was the Grange sponsored delegate to the 4-H summer school at Corvallis.

Bob Holmes announced the county fair and asked the Grange to discuss a booth. The matter was tabled until the next meeting. Mrs. Fern Runcorn announced a grange picnic at the Nyssa park July 31 at 1 o'clock. All members and their friends are urged to attend. The Grange will furnish ice cream and a drink.

Should a person buy a new car or a used one?
