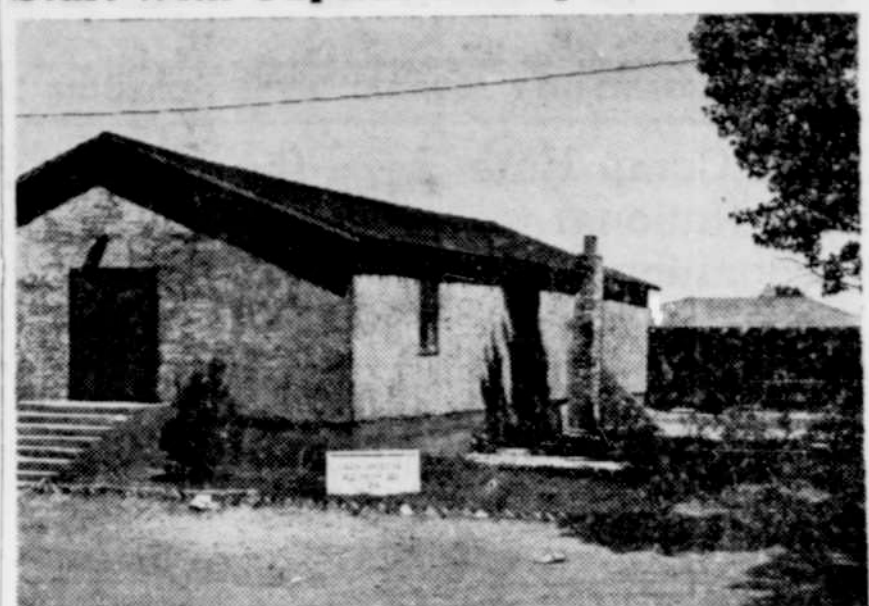
"And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake has forgiven you. Ephesians 4:32.

Latin Assemblies of God Church Gets Start With Capital Outlay of 13 Cents



A basement and 13 cents was the beginning of the Latin Assemblies of God church and parsonage at 106 East Fifth street in Nyssa, 1953 when the Rev. Joe E. Salazar came here.

A building program got underway Jan. 15, 1954 when the church foundation was started. Contributions of materials and funds from throughout the community, with all labor being donated, made it possible for the Rev. Salazar to hold his first services "above ground" on Easter Sunday of the same year. The structure is 30 by 50 feet.

When the building program started, church and Sunday school attendance was between 20 and 25 persons and the number in Sunday school has risen to 60 or 70 and about 85 average attendance at Sunday evening church services.

In April of this year, the same volunteer workers started a parsonage back of the church and Rev. and Mrs. Salazar and their children were able to move last month. The parsonage is not fully completed, but that work will be done from time to time, the pastor stated.

The Rev. Salazar said that all materials for the two buildings cost approximately \$3000, all contributed by friends of the church, both business and individuals.

All plans were drawn by the church pastor.
