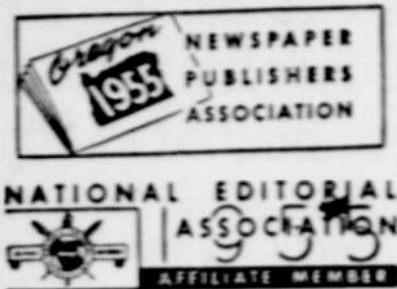

Missionary Will Speak on Sunday

Miss Dorothy Meyer, mission-  
ary to India, will speak at Faith  
Lutheran church Sunday during  
the 11 a.m. church services.  
For the past five years Miss  
Meyer has served as Bible woman  
in the mission of the American  
Lutheran church in South India.  
Her home in India has been  
Nayudupet, from which point she  
has made numerous field trips to  
neighboring villages, as well as  
ministering to the people of Nay-  
udupet, visiting in the homes and  
bringing the Christian message  
especially to the women of India.  
Her many interesting experi-  
ences will be the basis of her mes-  
sage when she speaks at Faith Lu-  
theran church. The public is in-  
vited to hear Miss Meyer's mes-  
sage at that time.  
Miss Meyer was born in Cam-  
eron, Idaho. She is a graduate of  
Pacific Lutheran college, Park-  
land, Wash., and has attended  
Biblical seminary in New York in  
preparation for her work in In-  
dia.  
She sailed for India in Septem-  
ber 1950 and has now returned on  
furlough following her first term  
of service in the foreign mission  
field.
