

Bulldogs Oustcored By Meridian In Run-Away Game By 33-6 Score

Deer Hunters Find Lots of Big Game As Season Opens

There was more venison in Nyssa this week than ever before, it seemed evident Wednesday.

Hunters who went out for the buck season, which opened Saturday, Oct. 1, reported unusual success in bagging their deer, with plenty of the fleet-footed seen in the Jordan Valley, Mahogany and Ironside regions.

Probably the first hunter to return with his deer was Hal Brendle, who went out before dawn and was back in town by noon, totting a 165 pound buck.

And as the day progressed, there was a steady stream of cars returning with animals on the running board or horns sticking out of the trunk.

Jake Fischer and Ed Taylor reported that their lockers were rapidly filling with venison, and home freezers were also being crammed with the meat.

Hunters unable to go out until Sunday also reported a generally successful day, with plenty of deer being sighted in almost every section within 100 miles of Nyssa.

The buck season will close on Friday, Oct. 14, but on the next day, there will be a new season, lasting until Oct. 23, for mule or black-tailed deer of either sex for those hunters possessing unused deer tags.

Sporting goods dealers said that judging from the amount of ammunition and equipment sold, more hunters went out from Nyssa this week than in any preceding year.

The second game of S.R.V. conference play got under way Friday night on a long kickoff from Lyle Petty to Joe Sanders. After three downs had lost the Bulldogs about 8 yards, Larry Schenk kicked out to about the 40 yard line where Leavitt of Meridian fumbled and Nyssa recovered. The Bulldogs couldn't get clicking, though, and had to punt again, this time Leavitt held the ball. It took Meridian 11 plays to go 70 yards for their first T.D. scored by Leavitt on a pass from Petty.

Nyssa again took the kickoff, and Don Nolen took the ball to the Meridian 45 for the first Nyssa penetration of Warrior territory. The Bulldogs were again forced to punt ending the first quarter. Meridian took the pigskin and marched to the goal line using five first in ten made mostly on the running of Lyle Petty and Dennis Leavitt. The conversion was good, making the score 14-0 at the end of the first half.

The second half ran true to form with the first half with Meridian taking a deep kickoff and taking only 12 plays to go the distance for the third T.D. The conversion was good making the score 21-0 with Nyssa on the short end of the score.

Nyssa took the kickoff but was again forced to punt. The same pattern was followed and Meridian scored again, but missed the conversion leaving the score 27-0. Nyssa took the kickoff and finally got clicking when a pass from Larry Schenk to Savage was intercepted by Petty. The Nyssa line held the Warriors and Nyssa took over the possession of the pigskin but to no avail. Again they were forced to punt. Meridian this time passed for the T.D., again missing the conversion leaving the score 33-0. Nyssa took the ball and really clicked, finally scoring on a pass from Schenk to left end Vernon Pond in the end zone. The conversion was good making the score 33-6. The rest of the game was a see-saw battle around the midfield stripe.

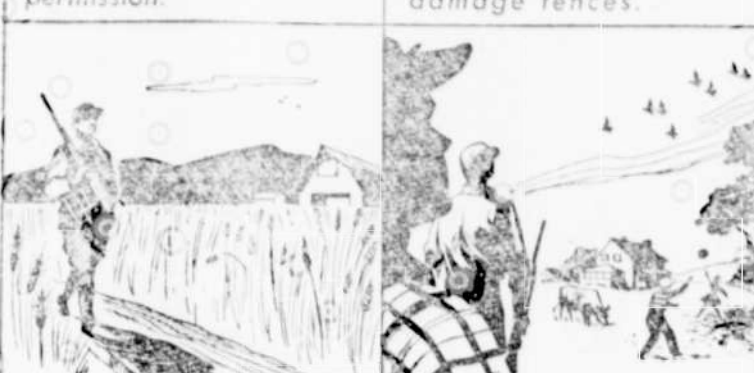

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Malheur Water Reservoir to be Given Treatment

The Oregon State Game commission yesterday issued an emergency notice that Malheur reservoir will be poisoned on next Thursday, Oct. 13.

R. C. Holloway, chief of the information and education section of the commission, said the action is being taken in the interest of all fishermen. The reservoir has not been chemically treated since 1950.

"The reservoir is so low now that we feel it is a good time for retreatment," he said. Bill Lightfoot, regional supervisor of the commission, urged that people stay away from the reservoir during the water treatment.

Hard to Reach

"In the first place, it would be a difficult place to reach, since there are mud flats all around," he said.

"With the water down low, we expect to purely it quickly and give the country good fishing area for the future."

It will be from one to six weeks before the toxic condition of the water will be removed, according to Holloway.

But at the conclusion's plans period, the commission's plans are to restock the pool with rainbow trout.

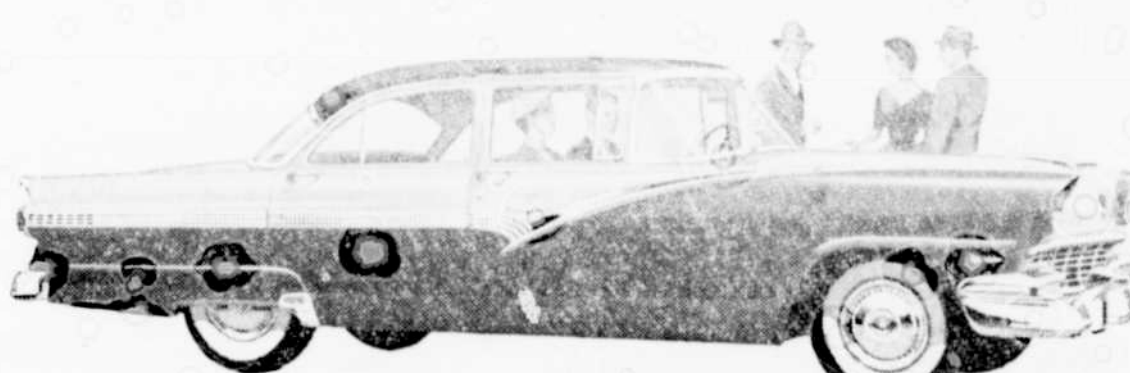
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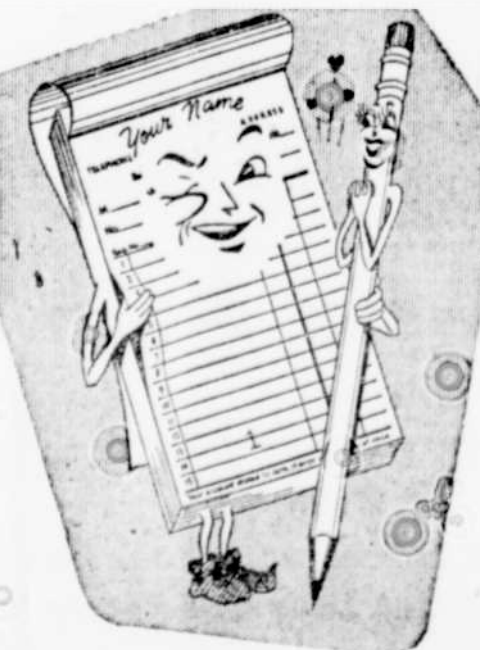
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
